Two years before assuming the Presidency **Thomas Jefferson** wrote, "[I am] for freedom of the press, & against all violations of the constitution to silence by force & not by reason the complaints or criticisms, just or unjust, of our citizens against the conduct of their agents." Jefferson was sometimes the target of the press, but defended it even as an old man when he wrote, "...the only security of all is in a free press. The force of public opinion cannot be resisted, when permitted freely to be expressed. The agitation it produces must be submitted to."

Today, the "free press" includes social media, websites, television and radio in addition to print publications. Public opinion abounds; agitation abounds. How do we protect our ideals of free expression, our search for truth, and our republic simultaneously?

## League Day at the Legislature – Wednesday, March 8, 2017

Join League members and your state board for this action-packed day of attending hearings in the legislature, discussing testimony presented, analyzing the executive sessions that might happen in committees, and seeing for yourself how your state legislature works. Board members will accompany small groups to committee hearings of the groups' choosing.

Over lunch we will debrief, possibly have a guest speaker.

After lunch attendees can opt for a tour of the state house guided by the visitor center staff or participate in an advocacy workshop conducted by League board members.

Cost for this happy event including a lovely catered lunch is \$20, payable at the door. However, **pre-registration is absolutely required** so we can handle logistics. **Limited to 30 League members.** Sorry, we are unable to include non-members this time.

Because we don't yet have the list of committees that will be meeting on this date, and because snowstorms have been occurring mid-week this year, be sure to leave your phone number in case we have to postpone.

Finish by 2:00; go to more hearings if you wish or enjoy downtown Concord before heading home.

Workshop #1, 10:30 - 12:00 pm. *Integrity of Journalism*. John Christie and Naomi Schalit, Maine Center for Public Interest Reporting.

John and Naomi are the co-founders of MCPIR. John continues to serve as senior editor for the Center. He is a media executive whose 40-year career includes work in four states as a writer, editor, general manager and publisher for newspapers owned by Tribune Co., Dow Jones and Co. and the Seattle Times Co. Naomi is a senior reporter for the Center. She has written for magazines and newspapers around the country, worked as a columnist for the Maine Times, and for five years was an award-winning reporter and producer at Maine Public Radio.

Workshop #2, 1:15 - 2:45 pm. *Civics Education*. <u>Tom Kerr-Vanderslice</u>, Rhode Island Executive Director for Generation Citizen.

Tom came to Generation Citizen (a civics education program used in several states including MA and RI) in 2012 after working in politics for a number of years. He has worked in public and private lobbying in Washington, D.C. and in Rhode Island for good government organizations, education nonprofits and healthcare institutions. He also served as the Finance and Campaign Director for a Maryland state campaign for Comptroller.

Workshop #3, 3:00 - 4:30 pm. *Distrust of American Institutions*. Dan Shea, Professor of Government at Colby College and Director of the Goldfarb Center for Public Affairs and Civic Engagement.

The author or editor of more than 15 books and dozens of articles/chapters on the American political process, Dan Shea continues to pursue research on campaigns and elections, the dynamics of the party system, the changing nature of the presidency, the politics of scandal, and grassroots political activism. In 2012 he authored *Let's Vote: The Essentials of the American Electoral Process*, and coedited *Can We Talk? The Rise of Rude, Nasty, Stubborn Politics*.

We close on Saturday with our annual benefit raffle, with prizes contributed by League members. Prizes will be on display and tickets will be available on Saturday, \$5 each or five for \$20. Proceeds

from the raffle support this and future New England League Leadership conferences.

Barbara is a League leader in Bangor, Maine, and member of the LWVME state board. Since 1991, she has been executive director of the Bangor Public Library and serves on the Maine Library Commission, in addition to other civic engagements.
