LWV-L/DC INVITES NOMINATIONS FOR 2021 HELEN FLUKER OPEN & ACCESSIBLE GOVERNMENT AWARD

Each year since 1999, the League of Women Voters of Lawrence-Douglas County has recognized a Kansas citizen for contributions to transparency in government. The award is given in honor of the late Helen Fluker, a long-time League member who served twice as its president.

The League invites nominations of a person worthy of recognition for contributions to his or her community.

The nominee should be a Kansas resident over age 18. The activities for which he or she is nominated may be volunteer work or part of a regular job position. Some examples of accomplishments worthy of consideration include:

- Improving public access to local or state government processes
- Educating the public about an issue of importance
- Working for greater accountability from state and local representatives
- Legislating or promoting legislation to increase government transparency

If an organization is nominating, the nominee does not need to be a member. Prior years' nominees are eligible for resubmission.

A nomination form is also available at http://bit.ly/FlukerLWV. The deadline for nominations is Monday, March 1, 2021.

The award will be presented in Lawrence, Kansas on Saturday, May 1, 2021, via Zoom.

LAWRENCE/DOUGLAS COUNTY LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS BEATS THE VIRUS

At noon on December 17th, eleven members in two separate but simultaneous sessions participated in a

one-hour planning meeting to discuss ways that the local league could take community action to "Beat the Virus". This effort, sponsored by the Kansas Leader-

ship Center (KLC) https://kansaslead-ershipcenter.org/ks-beats-the-virus/, Climate and Energy Project (CEP) and the State of Kansas, was established to combat the spread of COVID-19 by developing local solutions to keep Kansans healthy, schools and businesses open and the KS economy strong amidst the pandemic. In December, 855 meetings were held statewide with over 799 actions developed. At least three KS League Chapters held Beat the Virus meetings: Lawrence/

Douglas County, Emporia and Leavenworth.

For LWV-L/DC, Kristin Salmans convened Group I and Kay Johnson convened Group 2. CEP donated a \$100 honorarium for each session held so our league raised \$200 to be used as needed. During the one-hour meeting, members identified many ideas for our group. Due to many league activities and the holidays, it was determined there wasn't enough time to plan for and act on a large project. However, both groups discussed getting messages out on social media and email with little to no cost. Kristin will evaluate the list of actions compiled by both groups. Social media messages and additional actions will be discussed at the next board meeting.

In the meantime, continue to wear masks, keep your distance from others, and refrain from attending large group gatherings. General information is available at the Lawrence/Douglas County Public Health website at https://ldchealth.org/442/COVID-19-2019-Novel-Coronavirus

Kristin called the meeting to order at 2:08 p.m. Tracy moved and Melissa seconded that the October minutes be approved. Motion carried. (There are no November minutes because the meeting was cancelled.) Marjorie announce that we have four new members: Kail Marie, Carol Bloom, Sophie Cunningham and Sarah Melody.

ELECTION AND VOTER SERVICE RECAP:

Ma'Ko'Quah reported on MTTP activities. Cruising for Voters events were held in September and October. Door to door canvassing using Smart Van software began September 19. Twenty volunteers knocked on 1265 doors and five volunteers phoned 238 people. A total of 750 post cards were mailed. We coordinated with ELNA to place hangers on every door in that neighborhood. She suggested that in the future we have two people in charge to help stay up with record keeping and that it is important that we continue to develop partnerships.

TREASURER: Melissa reported income of \$2,423.44 in October (dues \$894.90, contributions \$115, grants \$1,104.60, LWV-EF \$308.94) and expenses of \$3,757.62 (web site \$400, LWV-EF \$180, MTTP Coordinator \$2,440.67, postage \$159.29, state meeting reimbursement -\$128.84, state PMP \$706.50).


