Proposed Dues Increase for Fiscal Year 2021-2022

The following is a proposal for a dues increase that will begin with our new fiscal year. This increase requires a vote of the membership which will be held at our annual meeting currently scheduled for April 19th, 2021. Our dues have not changed since 2013 when a sliding scale based on self-reported income was adopted by the membership. This increase is prompted, in part, by increase in per member payment fees at the Kansas state level (\$20 for an Individual; \$30 for a household) that will be effective April 1, 2021. Addi-

tionally, we are anticipating an increase at the National level where the fees are currently \$32 for an individual: \$48 for a household.

Highlights of the changes: Students, 16 years and older, will be welcomed FREE. We have had significant numbers join, both from high school and college, when the experimental fee for students was lowered to FREE. We encourage membership at this level because the sooner people become civically engaged, the greater the likelihood they will remain civically engaged.

The first tier of dues (based on self-reported income) will be \$25.00 – or WHATEVER YOU CAN PAY. Those underserved by our community and underrepresented at the polls are often also in the lower income bracket. We want to encourage all people to increase their voter education and become politically active, regardless of income. - Melissa Wick, Treasurer

By-Laws and 501(c)3 Committee Report

At last spring's virtual convention, a committee was formed to review the Bylaws and investigate creating a 501(c)3. A committee has been meeting and will propose to the upcoming convention in April for approval of revised Bylaws. Some language was added to expand explanation in Section 5 Meetings – specifically electronic meetings and use of proxy representation. Similar language was added to Article V - Officers regarding teleconferencing and remote access to conduct League business. As our organization works to obtain 501(c)3 status, which will allow all donations to be tax deductible, language the IRS requires was added to Article VI, Section 5 of Financial Administration. This language deals with distribution of funds if there is dissolution of our league.

Voter Suppression Watch Dos & Don'ts for Voter Curnout

The Nonprofit Vote has released their November 2020 National Voting Report.

Kansas ranks down 31st for voter turnout of the eligible population. The 10 states with the highest turnout had either or both: same day voter registration or mailed ballots to all registered voters.

The 10 states with the lowest turnout had either or both: 4 week cut off for voter registration before the election, or an excuse required for a mailed ballot.

70% of the voters across the nation voted either by mail or early, compared to 30% who voted on election day.

Monthly Green Challenge

Each month, we challenge members to take one action toward living a "green," sustainable life-style and fighting climate change. This month's challenge:

As the world's #1 producer of plastic waste, the US generated 46 million tons in 2016, more than 280 pounds for every person in the country. The average American eats, drinks, and breathes in more than 74,000 microplastic particles every year, according to a 2019 calculation.

Kick the plastic habit: Avoid single-use plastics by using cloth bags to carry groceries and other purchases; carry a reusable water bottle; choose plastic-free school and office supplies; use plastic bags to recycle shredded paper; wash and reuse various plastic bags and containers and/or cover refrigerated food with cotton wraps; use glass or steel straws; use cloth rags

This information will be included in the next VOTER and be presented at our Annual Meeting in April for a vote by the membership. Melissa, Emily and Kristin will hold a committee meeting to prepare the budget for the coming year. Marjorie agreed to audit the treasurer's books for 2020-2021.

COMMUNITY PARTNERS: Ma'Ko'Quah reported that seventeen participants attended the meeting on Super Bowl Sunday. Our first priority is encouraging community wide COVID vaccination. We will work with LMH Health to get information out using door hangers, fliers and canvassing. Other priorities suggested were consolidation of community election forums, getting the Medicaid expansion message out, and bringing climate change to the forefront.

DEI COMMITTEE: Tracy announced that current goals were finalized at a meeting on January 21st. The committee looked at a developed survey and will review feedback before sending an approved final copy to the membership. They plan to use Survey Monkey so responses will be anonymous.

ONGOING BUSINESS: Sunday, September 19 was selected for our Annual Candidate Picnic. We plan to participate at the KS State Fair on Saturday, September 11.
