





Demographics Survey Results


- •Developed by the LWVWI measure the diversity of membership across several variables including ethnicity, age, gender, income, education, and ability status, etc.
- •Purpose is to create a baseline population profile of our local League, surface areas where we can direct diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) action
- •40 participants (more than half of membership responded) in January 2021.
- •90% White, 7.5% Black or African-American, 2.5% Some Other Race or Mixed Race














What kind(s) of accommodation(s) would allow you to more fully participate in League events? Please check all that apply.






- For me, League activities are fully accessible

- Wheelchair access





- When our children were smaller childcare would have been very helpful!


































