
## **BALLOT MEASURE TIME!**

A long time active and devoted League member, and Mary's Woods resident, Mary Bartholomew passed on September 1, 2024. Her most recent "claim to fame" in League activities was the collection of the most signatures on Measure 114, the 2022 ballot initiative that required permits to purchase firearms and banned high-capacity magazines. It was hard to say no to Mary!

Mary was born in Fresno, California and lived in Salem, Oregon before moving to Mary's Woods in Lake Oswego. Mary is the matriarch of a large family consisting of two sons, three daughters, fifteen grandchildren and fourteen great grandchildren!

Mary earned her BA from UC Berkeley and her MS from Oregon College of Education (Western Oregon University). Mary was an elementary teacher in Oakland, CA and Salem, OR as well as being a speech pathologist in Salem, public schools. Mary was a member of the Oregon Speech and Hearing Association, League of Women Voters, Habitat for Humanity and American Association of University Women. In her free time she enjoyed wilderness canoeing, back packing and world travel.

A vibrant member of whatever community she was a member of Mary will be missed. However, she has left us all a wonderful legacy and a well-worn path to follow in her footsteps!

That is the mission statement of the Civics Learning Project. Two speakers, Chris Hughes and Abby Laufman, spoke to LWV members at our kickoff dinner Oct. 1. Their Oregon Civics Reach Initiative continued impact expansion across Oregon, supporting K-12 educators statewide with essential civics professional development and classroom supports to meet their growing needs. In total, they increased 23% in outreach and impact with 1,533 teachers and 173,184 students statewide.

There are volunteer opportunities League members can participate in: \*Mock Trial \*We the People \*Courthouse Experience Tours \*Community Action Projects \*Conferences & Workshops. (Check out their website at civicslearning.org)

Here are a few big accomplishments by students and their teachers and coaches:

- Four Oregon schools were nationally recognized for their CLP-supported work: Grant HS won the 2024 national We the People competition while Lincoln HS finished in the top 10. Roosevelt HS and Cascade MS earned Superior rankings for their Community Action Projects.
- CLP Program Managers doubled professional development opportunities
- Rural teacher and student support grew by 35%, reaching nearly 14,000 more students than the previous year.

With this kind of curriculum and experiential support, Oregon students will have access to the tools and motivation to engage with their communities and vote in elections.
