

News from LWVUS

January 9 was Carrie Chapman Catt's birthday. In a little over a month from now, we will be celebrating the birthday of her most enduring legacy. the League of Women Voters. Looking back at the political landscape that faced women voters when the League was created, we see many similarities to the current climate. Moneyed special interests wielded great influence and politicians responded to those interests with little regard for facts or evidence. "The League of Women Voters was an experiment. It was a wholly new thing and no one could tell...in which direction its evolution would go," said Catt at National Convention in 1921, "but I am satisfied...that every woman here...is convinced that there is work and a big tremendous work for the League of Women Voters to do...and that the League of Women Voters is going to give the greatest service in all the world to womanhood...So I look to the League of Women Voters to lead us out of this stage of discontent, which is common to our own country and to all the others in the world."


