

#### Successful Screening of "Equal Means Equal"

A great mix of about 70 students, community members and LWV members were on hand at Anoka-Ramsey Community College's Legacy Room for our screening of the documentary film, Equal Means Equal, on the evening of November 13. The event was co-sponsored by LWV ABC and Anoka Ramsey Community College. The film explores gender inequality in the United States using real life stories, precedent setting legal cases, interviews, news footage, facts, figures, and even occasional humor. It makes a case for why men and women should be fighting to get the Equal Rights Amendment passed. The small group discussions that followed the film provided great sharing of reactions by both men and women.
