Sad news – the passing of two LWV ABC members

In Memorium - Erika Sitz We were saddened to learn of the passing of longtime LWV member, Erica Sitz, on November 27. She was instrumental in lobbying for passage of the bill to include Boundary Waters Canoe Area as a designated federal wilderness area in the late 1970s. Erika was a lifelong environmental activist who staved politically active her entire life. As shared in her obituary. Erika and husband Paul were avid birders with fond memories of watching the sandhill cranes over the Platte River in Nebraska in the spring and the Sherburne National Wildlife area in the fall. A memorial service was held for Erika on December 15 at the Izaak Walton League. Breckenridge Chapter House in Brooklyn Park. She was an active supporter of "Ike's" issues and often lobbied Congress and the Minnesota Legislature. Her vigorous commitment to conservation issues will be missed.

After her MS retirement she was a volunteer coordinator for the local Meals on Wheels for over 25 years, a volunteer caller for Family Table and the Blood Drive at Zion Lutheran in Anoka. She lobbied for the Permanent Absentee Ballot Application to ensure that voting was always a right for all. She was a proud member of the League of Women Voters for over 30 years." National Voter Registration Day was a big success! A big thanks to everyone who supported National Voter Registration Day in 2017! Thanks as well to all who completed the partner survey to let us know how your events fared.

We tallied all the figures, and the final numbers just blew us away! Thanks to the involvement of 9,631 volunteers from 2,851 partners across the country, we collectively gathered 124,290 new or updated voter registrations. Both of these numbers far exceeded our original goals of 2,000 partners and 75,000 registrations.

Candidate Forum for City of Ramsey's Special Primary Election – HELP NEEDED!



Voters in Ramsey will have an opportunity to hear from candidates for the vacant councilmember atlarge seat in an LWV ABC forum on Wednesday evening, January 10, at Ramsey City Hall, 7550 Sunwood Drive NW. The forum begins at 7:00 pm in council chambers.

The Special Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, February 13. Candidates are Skip Carlson, Sue Suchy, Chris Riley, and Ida Theis. The two candidates who receive the most votes at the Special Primary Election will be on the ballot for the Special General Election on Tuesday, April 10.

"We hope voters will participate in this public event that provides opportunities to meet candidates, propose questions, and learn more about local issues," said LWV ABC Voter Services Co-Chair Geri Nelson. The forum will be taped by QCTV for multiple broadcasts on cable television as well as online viewing on QCTV's website

With the sole board selection criteria being low bid, ECM and Press Publications were awarded bids at the January 2 Organizational Meeting of the Anoka County Board. The bids are contained with the <u>Agenda for the December 19 Management Committee</u> and with the <u>Agenda for the January 2 Board Organizational Meeting</u>.

The statewide group awarded the President's Award to County Board Chairwoman Rhonda Sivarajah. The award is given each year for "exemplary leadership in public service." Gary Hendrickx, the association's board president, described Sivarajah as one of the state's "foremost experts in the field of human services" and touted the county's fiscal

accomplishments under her leadership, including the lowering of the tax levy for the

first time in four


decades and paying down more than \$50 million in debt.
