July 9 LWV ABC Meeting: Sandy Hook Promise



Mary Cook and Jefferson Fietek, Sandy Hook Promise Ambassadors from Sandy Hook Promise Anoka-Hennepin Branch, will address the issue of the epidemic of violence in our schools at the July Program Meeting on July 9 at 6 p.m. at the Andover City Hall's Senior Center 1685 Crosstown Boulevard NW, Andover.

Ms. Cook and Mr. Fietek will talk about programs offered by Sandy Hook Promise that address issues of student isolation, de-escalation of students in crisis, suicide prevention and knowing the signs to look for when a student is considering hurting themselves or others. They will also address the new initiatives recently rolled out by Sandy Hook Promise that help students better report warning-sign incidents and also how to start clubs in their school that promote inclusive environments. The presenters will talk about action steps community members can take to help address this national crisis.

The public is invited for light supper at 6:00 pm. At 6:30 we will move down the hall from the Senior Center to City Council chambers, and the program starts at 6:40 p.m. QCTV will be recording the event for future cablecast.





Highlights of June 25, 2018 LWV ABC Board Meeting submitted by LWV ABC Secretary Arlene Gillett

The LWV ABC Board meets on the fourth Monday of each month, usually at the Davanni's in Coon Rapids (see earlier story for info on the July 23 meeting which will be held at the Anoka County Historical Society). All members and invited to attend; we gather at 11 and order lunch, then eat while we meet, ending around 1pm. At each meeting, we review the treasurer's report and discuss matters relating to upcoming meetings, projects and more. At the June 25 meeting, the need for volunteers to assist with Voter Service activities was discussed. As Geri Nelson always says, "Everyone in LWV ABC is on the Voter Service committee, so we all need to pitch in!" Here's what's needed now (in addition to all the forums):

<u>Voter Service has many exciting volunteer opportunities</u> for members this summer and fall. Look them over, and let Geri Nelson or Arlene Gillett know which ones interest you, and we will get more information to you about them. Reply to lwvabc@lwvmn.org if you are able to help with any of these important and fulfilling volunteer opportunities.

- 1 **Fair Vote**. This is a state-wide project to look into the possibilities of Rank Choice Voting. Members are asked to work at the Fair Vote MN booth at the Anoka County Fair. League is doing a study on Rank Choice Voting, and we are currently for it as a choice if the community wants it.
- 2 League will be participating in the **Secretary of State's Mock Election** in state high schools again this fall. We coordinate with the state office to sign schools up for it, and then offer our assistance in setting it up, helping with the actual voting in the schools and in some cases, totaling the results. Many volunteers are needed in order to cover as many schools as possible.
- 3 **High School student voter registration**. League goes to area high schools in the spring and fall to offer on-site voter registration to eligible students. We contact the social studies teachers or guidance counselors, tell them about it and set up a date for our visit. We usually need 2 3 volunteers per high school, and we try to go to every high school in Anoka County. Enthusiasm for voter registration was high last spring, and we anticipate it will continue to be high this fall. Consider doing this it is a lot of fun, and very satisfying to be a big part of the whole election process.
