Every 10 years, states re-draw the boundaries of congressional and legislative districts. Redistricting is supposed to reflect changes in population and ensure that everyone is fairly represented. But politicians draw districts to give themselves or their party an unfair advantage. Common Cause believes voters should choose their representatives, not the other way around.

Like LWV, Common Cause is working to create better ways to draw districts that fairly represent our state's communities, whether that is independent commissions, non-partisan state staff, or

clear constitutional rules for how lines should be drawn. Annastacia will talk about redistricting in Minnesota, and the work that's going on to ensure that we have Fair District Maps.

Gather at 6 for a light supper in the Senior Center, then we will move down the hall to City Council chambers for Announcements and a short Council of Metropolitan Area Leagues (CMAL) presentation. <u>Annastacia Belladonna-Carrera from Common</u> <u>Cause</u> will speak at 7. LWV Minneapolis "Civic Buzz" – April 3, Minneapolis Omnibus Bills – Democracy in Action?

At 2:00 a.m. on the last day of the 2015 session a small committee amended the Omnibus State **Government Finance Bill to cut the core out of the State Auditor's job. There had been no bill,** no hearings, no testimony. This bill funded the entire state government. Had Dayton vetoed the bill, it would have shut down state government. The bill was signed and became law.

Omnibus bills thwart citizen efforts to follow the legislative process, much less participate in government decisions. Omnibus bills are packages of budget measures and policy changes, most of which began life as individual bills, but which have been bundled together into one enormous bill comprising sometimes more than 100 pages.



The individual bills comprising an omnibus bill were introduced by

legislators in the usual fashion, referred to appropriate committees, had hearings, testimony was taken, possibly they were amended – and then the committee chair announces, grandly, "House File XX will be laid over for possible inclusion in the omnibus bill." No vote is taken. Citizens who have come to the Capitol to testify leave with no idea how the committee might have voted on their bill. No committee member is accountable for a vote on this issue, since no vote is taken.

Omnibus bills, of which there are many every session, violate LWV's position that governmental bodies must protect the citizen's right to know and must facilitate citizen participation in government decision-making. Appeals Court Judge Jack Davies (ret.), a former state senator and current active lobbyist, will discuss how we arrived at this point in our "democratic" legislative process, and what, if anything, can be done about it.
