Census 2020 "Complete" Count in Coon Rapids Important to MN State Results

Our September meeting

The September LWV ABC meeting featured a panel presentation about the importance of the 2020 U.S. Census in Coon Rapids. In fact, the projected "under-count" of nearly 10,000 people in Coon Rapids alone, could negatively affect the entire Census count for the State of Minnesota—as the determination of either 7 or 8 Congressional districts is "on the line," based on this (once every 10 years) population count. That's why it will be important to reach those thousands of people who may not immediately complete their 2020 Census forms—scheduled to be received in home mail boxes just prior to April 1, 2020.



The importance of privacy and confidentiality of the Census data was also discussed.

Our League Participated in National Voter Registration Day

National Voter Registration Day is sponsored by the National Association of Secretaries of State, as well as other national election groups. The goal was to call attention to the need to register to vote—by reaching out to a variety of organizations and providing training and materials to encourage them to register as many people as possible on one date in September.

Our League participated in that effort this year, and set a goal of registering 50 voters. ABC League members went to four different sites during that week in September—including high schools, libraries, and adult basic education sites, and registered 16 voters. We are continuing our efforts at voter registration; our volunteers have gone to many Anoka County high schools and community events.
