# LWV ABC September 9 Meeting – LOCATION CHANGE!! Census 2020 – What do you need to know?

Coon Rapids City Hall - 6:30

Census 2020 - always controversial, but a complete count is critical for our communities, our schools and our state. Join us on September 9 at Coon Rapids City Hall to hear from census officials and community leaders about how one community in Anoka County is approaching the complete count conundrum.

Gather at 6:30 in the hall outside Council Chambers to view information on the 2020 Census and chat with other community members. The program begins at 7:00 sharp in Council Chambers. Because of the change of venue, we won't be having our usual light dinner, but there will be treats.









The panelists will include Matt Brown, Coon Rapids Economic Development Coordinator; Andrew Verdin, Director of Census Operations from the Minnesota State Demographer's Office; Kathy Tingelstad, former Minnesota State Legislator, and Amir Malik, civil rights attorney. LWV ABC President Gretchen Sabel will introduce and moderate the session. CTN Studios will record the event for cable TV.

Following the formal presentation, the audience can submit their own written questions to the panel. The meeting will adjourn at approximately 8 pm. The League of Women Voters of Anoka, Blaine and Coon Rapids Area (LWV ABC) and the City of Coon Rapids are sponsoring this event. 

Two Candidate Forums this fall:

**Anoka-Hennepin School Board Districts 1, 2, and 5**. Incumbents Marci Anderson (2) and Nicole Hayes (5) are unopposed and will appear together on Oct 2nd at the Sandburg Building on 2nd St in Anoka at 6:30 PM. Tom Heidemann (1) is being challenged by Erin Heers-McArtle. This district includes Anoka and Ramsey. The special

election for Ramsey city council Ward 3 will follow the school board candidates. Josh Fuhreck and Dan Specht are running.

The Primary Election for Anoka County Commissioner District 6 has 6 candidates vying to represent the eastern part of the county. The forum will be held at Lino Lakes City Hall, 7497 Lake Dr, Lino Lakes, MN 55014, on Tuesday, Oct 8 at 6:30 PM. We will need lots of people to go to this forum as the public is not used to LWV events in that part of the county.
