LWV ABC is committed to our principles, priorities and our mission. We will continue to work to address those critical issues that affect our community regardless of what happens at the state capitol or in Washington.

LWVMN, LWV ABC and other local Leagues in Minnesota are taking action to:

- Let our elected officials know they need to protect the voting rights of all Minnesota residents including:
 - o Same day registration, early voting and no excuse absentee voting.
 - o The right to vote without the unnecessary burden of a voter I.D. law.
 - Expanding voting rights to felons.
- Advocate for Campaign Finance Reform and nonpartisan redistricting.
- Pressure elected officials to address climate change.
- Block efforts to threaten women's reproductive rights.
- Support efforts to reduce gun violence.
- Support efforts to protect our water and other natural resources.

What can you do?

- Introduce a friend to League the more voices we have, the louder our message!
- Continue to work on issues of public importance in your communities.
- Meet with your elected officials to express your concerns and interests for the new legislative session especially around voting rights.
- Join our Observer Corps and report on the issue of transparency.
- Join the LWVMN Action Committee to help advocate for our state-wide priorities.
- Pre-register 16- and 17-year-olds to vote.
- Register new citizens to vote at naturalization ceremonies.
- Actively speak out write letters to the editor, post on social media to protest incidents of intolerance, discrimination, or incivility in your community.

Judges /Volunteers Needed! The Annual Anoka-Hennepin District Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Fair will be Saturday, January 21, 2017, 8 A.M. – Noon at Blaine High School. The Fair consists of students in grades K-12 presenting the findings of their research and experimentation to the public. The Fair is broken down into two divisions; grades 6-12 (8am – noon) and grades K-5 (8am – noon). With well over 1,500 students involved, this Fair is the largest of its kind in the entire State.

Community members are needed to be volunteers and/or judges at the Fair. Teachers can earn up to 5 CEU's! Prospective judges do not need science or math backgrounds. We provide training for all of the judges. We are looking for responsible adults who are willing to give something back to the community. Please consider being a judge/volunteer and feel free to share this opportunity with anyone whom you feel would be interested.

Why you should get involved: The STEM Fair is a showcase of students doing authentic science at its highest level. We have no other opportunity like it in our District. Students doing STEM Fair projects improve their critical thinking, public speaking and research skills. They learn the nature of science and what it means to be a member of the scientific community.
