Voting by Absentee Ballot: Vote-by-Mail in Knox County, Tennessee

STEP 1. Determine whether you qualify for by-mail voting.

Pursuant to the June 4, 2020 Order of the Davidson County Chancery Court, **ALL TN VOTERS can vote by mail for this reason**: "...I have determined it is impossible or unreasonable to vote in-person due to the COVID-19 situation." **EVERYONE AGE 60 OR OLDER QUALIFIES to vote by mail, even if the ruling is overturned on appeal**.

- If recently registered to vote in your county, you MUST vote in person the first time--unless you show a photo ID to staff at your County Election Commission Office prior to voting. Or, your doctor completes and files a "Physician's Statement."

STEP 2. <u>Download posted application for absentee ballot</u>: <u>https://www.knoxcounty.org/election/</u>
You must submit a request prior to each election <u>unless</u> you have a "Physician's Statement" on file.

STEP 3. Submit your request during the legal time period (90 to 7 days prior to Election Day*). You can submit in one of three ways with a handwritten signature:

Note: Once your request for a by-mail ballot is approved, you can <u>only</u> vote a provisional ballot in person, which will be checked to ensure the County did not receive a mail-in ballot from you.

STEP 4. Vote with your mail-in ballot. After you receive your ballot in the mail, be sure to:

- Carefully follow the instructions sent with your ballot.
- Mail the ballot in the required/signed envelope with adequate postage.
- Make certain your ballot will arrive no later than close of polls on Election Day.

IMPORTANT: ELECTION OFFICIALS CANNOT ACCEPT A HAND-DELIVERED BALLOT.

To ensure success, remember to:

- Submit your request for a by-mail ballot EARLY during the allowed time period. The Election Commission will contact you if there is a problem with your request.
- Sign your request application. Your <u>signature</u> must be handwritten; it cannot be typed. This means that your ballot request must be scanned if you are submitting it by email or fax.
- Include a complete address where you live—and, if different, a second complete address to mail ballot to.
- If the election includes a primary, indicate whether you want a Democratic or Republican ballot. You may request a "Knox County General Only" ballot.
- Provide first class postage.

*Aug. 6 Primary/General Election: May 8 - July 30; Nov. 3 Presidential/General Election: August 5 – October 27
