



Accessible Voting

Each Voter Assistance Center offers accessible services for voters with disabilities.

Vote in person - Accessible Ballot Marking Device (ICX)

The county has an accessible ballot marking device with audio that reads the ballot to you, a universal plug for personal assistive devices, touchscreen voting, and large print. Each Voter Assistance Center is equipped with three accessible ballot marking devices and have staff on hand to assist if needed.

Need a ride to vote in person?

If you cannot safely travel to a voter assistance center, you may contact one of the following agencies to assist you:

- **Butte County B-Line Transit** - Bus transportation assistance is available to voters through the Dial-A-Ride and Paratransit programs. It can take up to 21 days to process your request, contact B-Line Transit immediately at (530) 342-0221, or online at www.blinetransit.com/paratransit

Unable to go inside to vote – Request Curbside Voting

If you are unable to go inside a Voter Assistance Center, you may vote a paper ballot from your car. To request curbside voting assistance, you can have an assistant make the request inside any Voter Assistance Center or call in advance at (530) 552-3400 Option 1 or (800) 894-7761 within Butte County or press the curbside voting button located onsite in the designated ADA parking.

Unable to vote in person - Remote Accessible Vote By Mail Ballot

Any voter can request to have their ballot sent to them electronically. To use this service, return the postage paid postcard in your packet or call (530) 552-3400 Option 1 or (800) 894-7761 within Butte County. Please note a printer is required to utilize this service.

Other Accessibility Services
