

Proposed LWVPC Program of Work for 2026-2027

Advocacy platform adopted by the membership each year at the Annual Business Meeting. The Program is based on support for League Positions and League Principles.

1. Voter Service

a. Voter Registration

- Hold voter registration events at community events, public venues, high schools, colleges, and universities
- Partner with other organizations to register underrepresented populations, with an emphasis on young voters
- Participate in National Voter Registration Day

b. Voter Education

- Vote 411
 - 1. Work with LWVAR to publish all races in Pulaski County
 - 2. Advertise Vote 411 on social media and League communications
 - 3. Seek sponsorships/partnerships with media outlets
- Suffrage Timeline
 - 1. Partner with Little Rock and Pulaski County School Districts
- Get Out the Vote (GOTV)

c. Public Candidate Forums

- Conduct in conjunction with Little Rock Public Radio (KUAR), Central Arkansas Library System (CALS) , and other nonpartisan organizations

2. Membership

a. Develop a protocol to grow/retain/recapture membership

- Increase total membership by 5 (5.3% of May 30, 2026 roster of 95 members)

b. Develop diversity, equity, and inclusion implementation plan per LWVUS DEI policy

c. Engage members by offering programs and events of interest

3. Communications

Maintain effective communication and marketing plans for the League as part of every activity and project, including but not limited to:

- a. L WVPC website
- b. Monthly newsletter (The Voter)

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- c. Enhanced and targeted use of social media interaction with current, past, and future members
- 4. Good Government Opportunities
 - a. Advocacy
 - Continue to increase the Observer Corps Committee for the following:
 1. Little Rock Board of Directors
 2. Little Rock City Planning Commission
 3. Pulaski Quorum Court
 4. Pulaski County Planning and Adjustment Board
 - Take action on LWV public policy positions when appropriate, engage with governmental bodies, elected officials, and other stakeholders in the public interest on the issues and topics affecting Pulaski County
 - Support priorities of LWVAR by participating in:
 - i. Get Out the Vote (GOTV),
 - ii. Ballot measures
 - iii. Opposing voter suppression legislation
 - b. Support and engage in litigation, petition processes, and then ballot reform, for those efforts to amend the AR Constitution or other entities on issues aligned with LWV principles and policies
- 5. Strengthening the organization by
 - a. The Leadership Team accessing various training opportunities presented by LWVUS and LWVAR as needed or required
 - b. Having quarterly, targeted training for Leadership Team development
 - c. Creating committee structure to grow leadership
 - d. Creating standard operating procedures for each League portfolio (Communications, Finance, Membership, Observer Corps, Voter Service)
- 6. Create new partnerships, and enrich current partnerships, with the following organizations to expand our mission to underrepresented communities and encourage voting and civic engagement:
 - a. American Association of University Women (AAUW)
 - b. Arkansas Civic Action Network (ARCAN)
 - c. Central Arkansas Library System (CALS)
 - d. Citizens First Congress (Arkansas Public Policy Panel)

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- e. Community Churches/Faith Based Groups
 - f. Little Rock Public Radio (KUAR)
 - g. Neighborhood Associations
 - h. Pulaski County Clerk's Office
 - i. Youth groups, including ViPS (Volunteers in Public Schools, LRSD)
7. Annually create a member-driven list of topics for monthly membership meetings that supports our:
- a. Program of Work
 - b. LWV mission to empower voters and defend democracy
 - c. LWV vision: We envision a democracy where every person has the desire, the right, the knowledge, and the confidence to participate.
