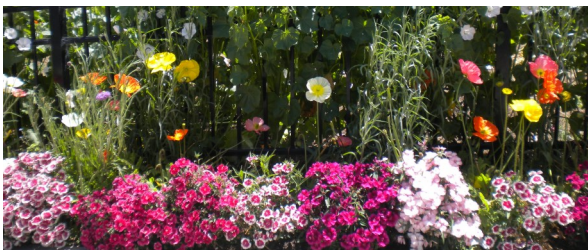

## ***Civic Contribution Awards to Be Presented on April 22, 2022!***

Remember the plan to present awards to Eric and Viviana Hollenbeck and Wanda Wahlund at the 2020 State of the Community luncheon? Covid 19 came along and disrupted that well laid plan (along with many others!) In the meantime, **Judy Bennett** and her SOCL committee members have considered alternative ways to honor these worthy individuals and have come up with a creative solution. **On April 22 from 12:00 to 1:00** the League will host an awards ceremony and an abbreviated State of the Community address by the Chair of the Board of Supervisors, Virginia Bass, at the Morris Graves Museum in Eureka. Only those with specific tasks will be present at the Morris Graves.](#)

A few words about the awardees, whom you may remember reading about two years ago: The Hollenbecks founded the Blue Ox Historic Village and School, which combines education, historic preservation, and old-time artisanship, including woodwork, lapidary, printing, and more. One of their projects involved enlisting veterans to work on the construction of the Lincoln Hearse, a replica that was featured in a reenactment of the procession carrying President Lincoln's body from Washington D.C. to Illinois. Eric and Viviana are a team with tremendous enthusiasm and vision for projects that will benefit the youth and veterans that they hold dear. The campus of the Blue Ox sees hundreds of visitors from all over the country and was recently featured in a program called "Our California," well worth taking a look at on YouTube.

Wanda Wahlund, community volunteer, is a woman who gets things done, often behind the scenes. She is a longtime member of the Freshwater Community League, which raises funds to keep the Grange open for activities including a senior exercise program. She has been an officer in Quota Club, which helps support a program in Blue Lake that aids women who are recovering from substance abuse issues. She is also instrumental in the local sales of See's Candy, based at the Discovery Shop in Eureka, raising funds for cancer patients to help with expenses including travel to treatment. Her energy and diligence have benefited other organizations as well, including the Cattlewomen's Association, which offers scholarships for high schoolers.

## ***Behavioral Health Study Update***

Some exciting developments have occurred recently in the realm of behavioral health services that will impact the work of our League study. At the state level is the recently announced expansion of funding to improve access to mental health crisis services for children and youth, focused on expansion of mobile crisis support teams (MCSTs), crisis stabilization and Children's Crisis Residential Program beds, plus family respite care. And, state Senator Mike McGuire announced he's introducing Senate Bill 1229, which would provide \$25,000 grants to aspiring mental health clinicians willing to work in high-need communities for two years. These programs speak directly to some of the issues our study is zeroing in on for potential inclusion in our position.

A new book was announced last week, *Healing: Our Path from Mental Illness to Mental Health*, that may be a game-changer in the world of behavioral health services and provides us with both excellent data and a wide range of best practices to consider including in our position. The author, Dr. Tom Insel, psychiatrist and neuroscientist, is a national leader in behavioral health research, policy, and technology and a former director of the National Institute of Mental Health. Our study committee members will be watching a one-hour video presentation he gave about his book last month at the University of California San Francisco; some of us will read and summarize the book as well.

Within our study committee itself, the exciting news is that we have moved into a period of hosting guest presenters at our monthly meetings. At our March 16 meeting, our first guest was local psychiatrist and passionate patient advocate, Dr. Katy Wilson. She provided a strong assessment of best practices and needed improvements in our local care system. Our guest presenter in April will be Dr. Ruby Bayan of Waterfront Recovery.

Finally, on March 17 LWVHC held a Zoom membership meeting to bring members up-to-date on our behavioral health services study (as these updates in *The VOTER* do) and to elicit suggestions, questions, and resources for the study. Many thanks to those who participated and shared their wisdom.
