#### Empowering Voters. Defending Democracy

#### Can autocracy happen in the U.S.?

Several media outlets recently discussed Donald Trump's announced plan to install an autocratic-style government should he be re-elected as President in November 2024. This is in keeping with his failed takeover of the Capitol on January 6, 2021, and his admiration for strongman dictatorships. Autocrats consolidate power in the executive branch, dismantle government agencies, and replace civil servants with appointees who serve at the pleasure of the executive leader. These are hallmarks of authoritarian governments, not democracies. Other candidates, too, are telegraphing beliefs in the "efficiency" of autocracy.

Autocratic capture of democracies occurs in the same way throughout the world. Autocrats boldly tell voters up front what they intend to do, they do not hide. History shows us that people do not take the messages seriously, they don't believe it will happen in their country. For a perspective read "How Democracies Die" by Levitsky and Ziblatt, 2018.

If you value democracy, make it clear to candidates and other voters that autocracy is not acceptable. The League highly values transparency and believes that our government should give notice, have open meetings, and provide records when requested. The League believes in balancing power between the legislative, executive, and judicial branches of government with competent staff dedicated to the rule of law, not loyalty to one person. #### **Education Committee**

The Education Committee met on June 15, 2023, to select lecture topics for the coming year. Paula Vaughan, who is organizing Making Connection meetings for 2023-2024, joined the committee so we could coordinate efforts. After discussing a long list of potential topics, the committee selected three for this year's lecture series: (1) the new school voucher program, (2) economic justice, which is the subject of a current LWVIA study, and (3) voter apathy.

Two events are already calendared. Randy Evans will lead a workshop on preparing Freedom of Information requests on Saturday, September 23, 1:00-3:00 p.m., at the Iowa City Public Library. And Joanne Ramos, author of "The Farm", will give the keynote address for One Community One Book 2023. She will speak on Sunday, October 8, 1:30-2:30 p.m., at C20 Pomerantz Center at the University of Iowa. LWVJC is a co-sponsor of this event. "The Farm" is a novel about commercial surrogacy. In an imagined place, a highend retreat for surrogate mothers called The Farm, Ramos explores a range of views on surrogacy, from altruism to exploitation.

### **Advocacy Update**

All of the Advocacy Committee's fine plans for the month of July were thoroughly disrupted by the announcement of the special legislative session to ban abortion in Iowa.

While this harmful and unpopular ban shows all signs of having been set on a fixed path before the session was announced, Johnson County advocates nonetheless sprang into action to both influence legislators and catch the public's attention. Members sent letters to newspapers, contacted legislators, submitted public comments on the bill, and traveled to Des Moines to protest.

Procedurally, all these efforts were dashed upon the majority party's decision to rush debate and refuse amendments or serious deliberation. However, from the speakers to the turnout at protests to the public comments (out of over 1,000 comments, 97% were against the bill), we did our part to show that Iowans overwhelmingly oppose this bill. Now we just need to help voters remember that at election time.

Our next event of note will be a presentation

about how to use the state legislature's website on Thursday, August 17. This event will be held at 7:00 p.m. in the Iowa City Public Library and will also be streamed. 
