## Voters may use one of the following photo IDs

Photo ID can be current or expired not more than 4 years Persons 70 years of age or older may use an expired

- Texas Driver license
- Texas Election Identification Certificate (EIC)
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
- US military identification card containing the person's photograph
- US citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph
- US passport (book or card)

If no photo ID, sign a simple form and present one of the following other documents:

- Voter registration card
- Certified birth certificate
- Current utility bill
- Bank statement
- Government check
  - Paycheck
- Or any other government document with voter's name and any address

#### Note

- Addresses on ID and voter registration need not match.
- Name on ID and voter registration must match or be substantially similar
- Election officials/poll workers may not question you about voter ID

# Who can register to vote?

- a citizen of the U.S.
- a resident of the county
- 17 years 10 months old (to vote Election Day). you must be at 18 years old on
- Not declared mentally incompetent
- If you have been convicted of a parole. (Off paper) only after you have completed felony, you may register to vote

### When do I register?

- At least 30 days before Election Day. Last day to register: Apr. 4th
- You do not need to register before every election!
- Update your voter registration if you change your name, address or tour years. you have not voted in the last

### How do I register?

- First, find out if you are already registered to vote at votetexas.gov
- Print a voter registration school! Fill out, sign and mail in! application or find one at your library, government offices, or high
