

## Voters may use one of the following photo IDs

**Photo ID can be current or expired not more than 4 years. Persons 70 years of age or older may use an expired ID.**

- Texas Driver license
- Texas Election Identification Certificate (EIC)
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
- US military identification card containing the person's photograph
- US citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph
- US passport (book or card)

**If no photo ID, sign a simple form and present one of the following other documents:**

- Voter registration card
- Certified birth certificate
- Current utility bill
- Bank statement
- Government check
- Paycheck
- Or any other government document with voter's name and **any** address

### **Note!**

- Addresses on ID and voter registration need not match.
- Name on ID and voter registration must match or be substantially similar.
- Election officials/poll workers may not question you about voter ID issues.

### **Last day to:**

- Register to vote: Apr 4
- Update registration: Apr 4
- Vote by Mail request received by Apr. 23
- Vote by mail ballot due May 4

## Register to vote!

### Who can register to vote?

- a citizen of the U.S.
- a resident of the county,
- 17 years 10 months old (to vote you must be at 18 years old on Election Day).
- Not declared mentally incompetent
- If you have been convicted of a felony, you may register to vote only after you have completed parole. (Off paper)

### When do I register?

- At least 30 days before Election Day. Last day to register: Apr. 4th.
- You do not need to register before every election!
- Update your voter registration if you change your name, address or you have not voted in the last four years.

### How do I register?

- First, find out if you are already registered to vote at [votetexas.gov](http://votetexas.gov)
- Print a voter registration application or find one at your library, government offices, or high school! Fill out, sign and mail in!
- Volunteer Deputy Registrars help voters register!
- Any registered voter can submit a voter registration application on behalf of an eligible spouse, parent or child.

## Be informed!

### What is on the ballot?

- Research candidates and issues with the League's nonpartisan *Voters Guide* at [VOTE411.org](http://VOTE411.org)
- Sample ballots are often on your county website
- Your voter registration card lists your candidate districts and precincts
- Attend a League candidates forum

### Where do I vote?

- Find polling places/times at [Vote411.org](http://Vote411.org) or on your county elections website or your local newspaper.
- Vote early at any early voting location.
- On election day, in some counties voters go to their precinct to vote. In other counties you can vote at any polling place.

## Be a Texas Voter!

### Vote in person!

- Vote early: Apr 22 - 30
- Vote on Election Day: May 4
- Tell a poll worker if you need help to vote
- Curbside voting available for persons with a disability
- The polls close at 7:00 pm on election day, but if you are in line at 7:00 pm, you must be allowed to vote.
- You can be assisted by any person of your choice in casting your ballot except by your employer or your union representative

### Vote by mail if you..

- Will be out of the county on Election Day and during the early voting period
- Are 65 years of age or older
- Are sick or disabled
- Are in jail but eligible to vote

### Apply to vote by mail

- 11 days before Election Day
- Last day to receive app. April 23.
- Print, fill out and mail an application found at [votetexas.gov](http://votetexas.gov) or [vote411.org](http://vote411.org)
