



## Why is voting important?

Voting is a process by which a group of people can decide things fairly. When a group of people votes, it is called an election.

Activity: ask your family members what type of ice cream they like best. Count up the votes! You just had an election! which flavor won?

In a democracy people use voting to choose government leaders.

Activity: Gather all of your stuffed animals and have them vote on a leader!


YOU will be able to vote one day! You can register to vote if you will turn 18 before the next general election.

The right to vote is called suffrage.

In the past, many countries allowed only white men to vote. In the United States, African American men gained the right to vote in 1870, after the end of slavery. Women in the United States won the right to vote by 1920.

It's important to use your vote as your voice ! You can make a difference when you vote.


