#### YOUTH SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT

Civic Education had a good summer!

First, in June, the Mass. Board of Elementary and Secondary Education approved the revised *History and* Social *Science Curriculum Framework*. The revised framework integrates civic education into the K-12 History and Social Science Curriculum and <u>creates a required Grade 8 course that focuses on American history and an in-depth study of civics with an experiential <u>approach</u>.</u>

A second success came when the Legislature--both House and Senate-- passed S.2631, <u>An Act to Promote and Enhance Civic Engagement.</u> The different versions of the bill went to a conference committee...which reached a compromise version ~ and sent it on to the Governor! The Governor did return the bill to committee asking for some small amendments stressing the importance of civic

experience's being non-partisan. Chances remain good that agreement will be reached on the amendment.

Together, these two actions will go a long way to improve civic education and to give it the infrastructural support that is needed.

To coincide with the emphasis on the Grade 8 curriculum, <u>our Committee has voted to offer two</u> mini grants to two districts to support creation of an experiential civics learning opportunity.

Matti has committed herself to attending County meetings when she can, but she can't attend them all. There are basically just 6 meetings a month. Please consider attending even one of them!




