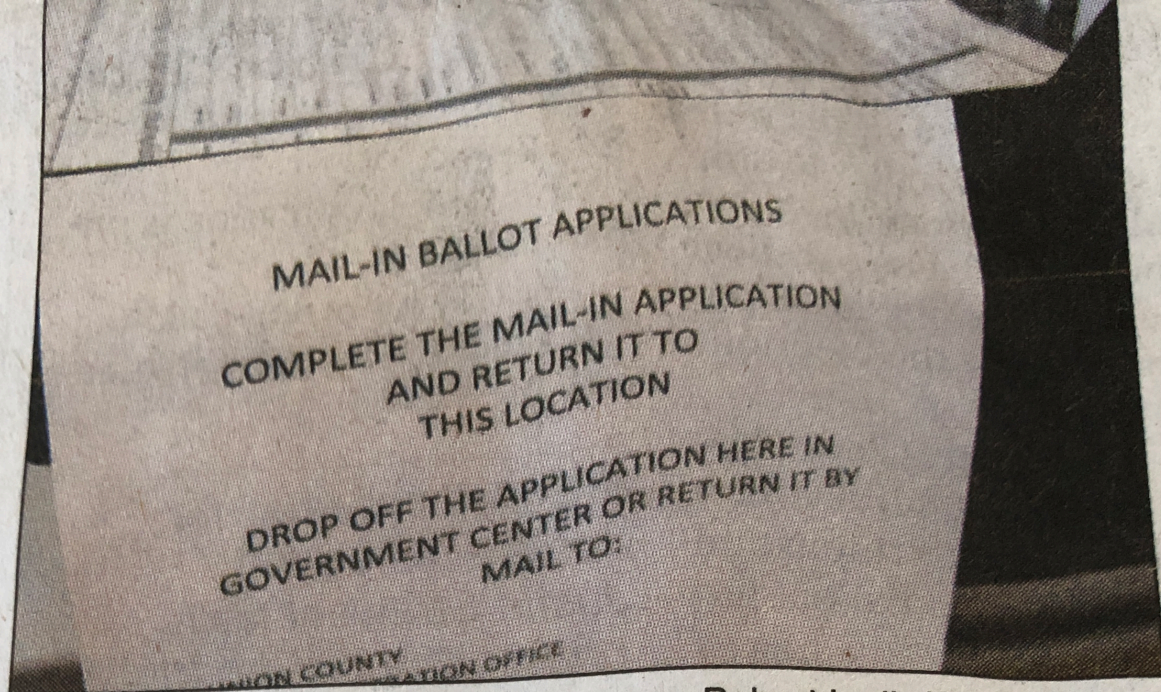

Union County board clears up confusion

Union County Commissioner Jeff Reber reinforced Tuesday that registered voters are eligible to vote early and in-person with either a mail-in or absentee ballot at the county's election office.

Reber, chairman of the county Election Board, acknowledged during a commissioners meeting at least

one voter was turned away by county elections staff and told to vote by mail after requesting a mail-in or absentee ballot to fill out and submit in person.

The requester may have to wait given how busy the elections office is this time of year but they should not be turned away, Reber said.
