Bring your lunch for an update on Wellesley's climate action initiatives. We will welcome Wellesley's Sustainability Director, Marybeth Martello, and Transportation Manager, Sheila Page for an important discussion about what Wellesley is doing to reach the Town's greenhouse gas emissions goals: to reduce town-wide greenhouse gas emissions to net zero by 2050 with interim targets to reduce these emissions 50% below a 2007 baseline by 2030 and 75% below the 2007 baseline by 2040. - Provide ad hoc support at Meet The Candidates Night, February 12, 2026

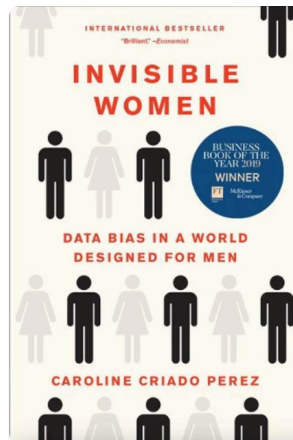

Engage Beyond Wellesley

The Racial Justice Initiative at Temple Beth Elohim Presents: The State of Democracy and Civil Rights

Wednesday, December 10th, 7:00-8:15 PM, HYBRID

Join the Racial Justice Initiative at Temple Beth Elohim as Rahsaan D. Hall, President and CEO of the Urban League of Eastern Massachusetts (ULEM), draws parallels between the Civil War's post-Reconstruction time period and today's retrenchment of our civil rights. His concluding remarks will address a commonly-asked question about how we can stay in community to amplify collective advocacy on these fundamental challenges confronting us today.

In its 49th annual report, **State of Black America**, the National Urban League unpacks the threats to our Democracy, the perilous slide towards authoritarianism, and the undoing of civil rights advances of the past 60 years. The Supreme Court's reinterpretations of The Voting Rights Act of 1965 dismantled voter rights protections, jeopardizing fair elections and accelerating an erosion of civil rights.
