
Intro: Citizen Initiative (CI)

- Enables voters to collect signatures and put a law or constitutional amendment directly on the ballot
- A year of study, consideration, and input from membership
- Recommending LWVNC concur with Alabama's position on Citizen Initiative



Why Citizen Initiative?

- Currently: ALL laws and constitutional amendments MUST go through the NC state legislature
- Gridlock? Nonresponsive? NC voters have no recourse
- With CI, voters can take issues directly to voters





How does CI work?







LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS'

2024

- NC Voters can consider only what the legislature wants us to consider
- About half of U.S. states have some kind of initiative process
- Citizen-initiated ballot measures were considered in 2024 that addressed these subjects and more!

57 Citizen-initiated Ballot Measures, 27 passed





- In 2024, 41 states considered 159 ballot measures
- Across 18 states, 57 measures were citizen-initiated
- Nearly half approved by voters

Enabling CI in North Carolina

- Requires a state constitutional amendment
- This position provides a framework for what we would like to see in that constitutional amendment



Why Alabama?

- Only existing position to explicitly address the critical need to protect representative and deliberative democracy.
- Provides sufficient detail to guide efforts in working towards a constitutional amendment that would enable CI.
- Not so specific that it hampers ability to negotiate to a workable solution.
- Addresses all 3 aspects of CI: preparation of an initiative, collection of signatures, and the campaign for passage and vote.



Preparation of Citizen Initiatives

- Clear to the voter
- Limit each Initiative to a single subject
- Protect constitutional rights
- Financial disclosures from sponsors
- Prohibit refiling of a failed Initiative for two years



- A reasonable time for collection
- Signatures from registered voters across all areas of the state.
- Financial disclosure from all organizations collecting signatures
- Minimum number of signatures based on established criteria
- Signatures validated before the initiative appears on a ballot

Collection of Signatures



Campaign for Passage and Vote



- Impartial analysis of the legal, level of service and fiscal consequences
- Only on general election ballots
- Laws require a simple majority vote
- Constitutional amendments need more than a majority
- Legislature can enact a <u>law</u> proposed by CI without the necessity for a ballot vote, if it is unchanged
- Legislature cannot <u>change</u> unless both the original and alternative measures are put before voters to choose
