

Here are some helpful hints for you as you fill out your voter registration cards.

Print all information in black ink. Follow above instructions for proper delivery.

1	Check one: Are you a Citizen of the United States of America? <input type="checkbox"/> Yes <input type="checkbox"/> No NOTE: If you checked "no," do not complete this form.		
2	Full name: <i>last name</i> <i>first name</i> <i>middle name or initial</i> If you are having your name changed today, write your NEW NAME in this area. <i>Jr. Sr. II III IV</i> (circle one if appropriate)		
3	Former name: <i>last name</i> <i>first name</i> <i>middle name or initial</i> If your name will be changed today, write in your OLD NAME. If you are not changing your name today, leave this blank. <i>Jr. Sr. II III IV</i> (circle one if appropriate)		
4	Address where you live now (<i>street number / street name / rural route number & box number / apartment number / city or town / zip code</i>): Your notice as to where you go to vote (your polling place) will be mailed to this address.		
5	Address where you receive all your mail (if different from #4): Can be a P.O. Box or any other place you want reminders, notices, etc. to be sent. If this address is the same as #4, just write "same as 4."		
6	Date of birth: <i>month day year</i>	7 Identification #: <i>license # or last 4 digits of SSN</i> Massachusetts drivers license or last four digits of your social security card.	8 Telephone (optional): <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <i>Check if unlisted</i> If there's a problem with your voter reg form (handwriting; left something out, etc.) your city/town clerk will call you to correct it. If you also check "unlisted," you won't get robo calls!
9	Party enrollment or designation (check one): <i>Democratic</i> <i>Republican</i> <i>Green-Rainbow</i> <i>Libertarian</i> <i>No Party (unenrolled)</i> <i>Political Designation (not a political party):</i> Choose the party you want to be enrolled in. If you are not sure yet, check "No Party (unenrolled)" and you can change the party when you go to vote.		
10	Address at which you were last registered to vote (<i>street number / street name / rural route number & box number / apartment number / city or town / zip code</i>): Leave this blank since you are a new voter.		
11	If the applicant is unable to sign this form, give the name, address and telephone number (optional) of the person helping the applicant: <i>name</i> <i>address</i> <i>telephone number (optional)</i> Fill in # 11 if you are helping someone fill out the form and are signing their form for them.		
12	I hereby swear (affirm) that I am the person named above, that the above information is true, that I AM A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, that I am at least 16 years old and I understand that I must be 18 years old to be eligible to vote, that I am not a person under a guardianship which prohibits my registering to vote, that I am not temporarily or permanently disqualified by law from voting because of corrupt practices in respect to elections, that I am not currently incarcerated for a felony conviction, and that I consider this residence to be my home. Signed under the penalty of perjury.		
13	Today's date: <i>month day year</i> This is the date you are sworn in.	14 Signed: <i>Sign your name here.</i> Do not sign until you are sworn in.	

If you will mail your form yourself, place it in an envelope first. These forms sometimes get stuck in post office sorting machines and can tear. Rev. 12/13/18

Last hint: If you are mailing in your completed registration form, place it in a 5 x 7" envelope first. The form, by itself, will sometimes jam in post office sorting machines.
