Important Information for Voters

PRIMARY ELECTIONS: February 14 was the last day to change Party Enrollment for the Primaries in June. The voter registration form should be used to change your party enrollment from one party to another or to enroll for the first time in a party. An application to change one's party enrollment for the primary election in any year must be received by the board of elections no later than February 14 of that year. Changes received on or after February 15 until seven days after the June Primary will be set aside and opened seven days following the June Primary and entered in the voter's registration record.

PRIMARY ELECTIONS TUESDAY June 24, 2025

Early Voting: June 14 - June 22

Although only enrolled members of a party can vote in that party's primary elections, registered voters may vote for any party's candidate on Election Day.



ELECTION INFORMATION YOU NEED

GENERAL ELECTION TUESDAY November 4, 2025

Early Voting: October 25 - November 2

REMEMBER: You must be registered in order to vote. You may register if you will be 18 years of age by Election Day, a resident of the county for at least 30 days prior to the election, and a citizen of the United States. 16 and 17 year-olds can now pre-register to vote, but will not be able to vote until they are 18. If you have moved in the state since the last time you voted, you will be able to vote on affidavit ballot in your new election district. However, we strongly recommend re-registering with your new address.

If Congress passes and the President signs the SAVE Act or a similar bill, Americans would be required to provide a birth certificate, passport, or other citizenship document to register or re-register to vote. If such legislation becomes federal law, please check with the NYS Board of Elections https://elections.ny.gov/ for details on how this could affect voters in New York State.

As a citizen (age 18 or older), you have the right and responsibility to vote in elections. Educate yourself on the candidates and issues in each election, whether local or national.

Once the Suffolk County Board of Elections has processed your registration, you will be mailed a card indicating your **polling place.** If you do not receive the card or have questions, you may call them at **(631) 852-4500**. You can also confirm your registration by visiting *https://voterlookup.alections.you*

You are able to vote Early in primaries (if registered in a party before February 14, 2025) and in the general election. **Early Voting** begins 10 days before the regular voting date and goes through to the Sunday before Election Day. You can vote at any Early Voting site in Suffolk County. These are different from your regular polling site and have different hours. Check with the Suffolk County Board of Elections to find the sites and times. Votes cast in Early Voting are counted on Election Day.

Any registered voter may apply for an **Early Mail Ballot**. You may apply for it online and get more information at https://elections.ny.gov/request-ballot, or go to your county Board of Elections.

You may apply for an **Absentee Ballot** if you will be out of Suffolk County on Election Day, or are unable to

Become a Poll Worker

The right to vote is one of our nation's oldest and most important entitlements, and with this right comes responsibility. Free and open elections are the basis on which this country was formed and you can make a difference by becoming a poll worker to help protect those freedoms.

appear at the polls due to temporary or permanent illness, disability or duties related as primary caretaker of a physically disabled or ill person, a resident or patient of a Veterans Health Administration Hospital, or in jail or prison for any reason other than a felony conviction, This includes anyone who is awaiting grand jury action, awaiting trial, or serving a sentence for a misdemeanor. You can request a ballot via an application, letter, fax or online at https://elections.ny.gov/request-ballot. Once processed, you will receive your ballot in the mail.

If an Absentee Ballot or Early Mail Ballot is issued to you, you may not vote on a Voting Machine during Early Voting or on Election Day. Ask for an Affidavit Ballot.

ID Needed for Voting in New York State

Federal law requires persons who register by mail for the first time to provide identification. Identification means a current NYS driver's license or the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you do not have either of these, you may provide a copy of a valid photo ID, or a current utility bill, bank statement, government check or some other government documentation that shows your name and address. If you do not provide identification when you register, you may be asked for it the first time you vote.

NEVER LEAVE THE POLLING PLACE WITHOUT VOTING!

If your name is not on the list, ask for an affidavit ballot!

On Election Day all polling places in Suffolk County are open from 6am to 9pm.

The Vice President - The President nominates a Vice President who must be confirmed by majority vote of both houses of Congress. The legal order of succession after Vice President is: Speaker of the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, members of the Cabinet in a specified order (beginning with the Secretary of State).



Suffolk County 2025 Operating Budget

Budget Overview

The total Suffolk County 2025 Adopted Operating Budget is \$4.1 billion, which represents \$2,679 for each adult and child in the county.

Suffolk County prepares two budgets each year: the operating budget and the capital budget and program. The capital budget must be adopted by the Legislature by June 30 for approval by the County Executive. The 2025 Adopted Capital Budget is \$535,014,841. The Community College budget is approved prior to the start of the academic year on September 1. The 2024-2025 Adopted Suffolk County Community College Operating Budget is \$211,527,193. The following paragraphs address only the County's 2025 operating budget. The fiscal year for the operating budget starts January 1.

The information included here can only be considered an overview of a quite complex subject.

Operating Budget timeline

- The County Executive holds two hearings on his proposed budget in August.
- The County Executive submits his proposed budget to the Legislature on or before the third Friday in September.
- The Legislature holds two hearings, completed by October 31.
- By November 10, the Legislature must act to amend the proposed budget, and submit it to the County Executive.
- The County Executive may veto the whole budget, or individual line items, before November 21, or the budget is adopted as submitted.

Points to keep in mind:

Revenue comes from property taxes, sales tax, state aid, federal aid, and other sources.

The revenue stream included in the budget is only an estimate of the amounts that can be anticipated. If retail sales fall, the 8.75% sales tax yield will not be as great as anticipated. Similarly, if homeowners and business owners do not promptly pay their property tax, there is a shortfall. The county may borrow money in anticipation of receiving this revenue; therefore, debt service may be required because of this borrowing. A general view of the 2025 anticipated revenue is shown in pie chart A.

Expenditures are for personnel, debt service, and a wide variety of services, such as police, education and economic assistance. Some expenditures are mandated by the state and federal government, which restricts the freedom of the county to apportion expenditures.

The proposed 2025 expenditures are shown in pie chart B. The largest functions are economic assistance, employee benefits and public safety. Transfer to other funds represents interdepartmental transfers for services, such as personnel benefits, vehicle maintenance, etc. About 41% of the \$4.1 billion budget is "mandated" by various state and federal programs, such as Medicaid. The remainder is "discretionary."

Comparison:

- The taxable full valuation of property in the county is \$470.5 billion. According to the 2020 census there were 578,940 households in Suffolk County.
- According to the 2020 census, the county population 1.5 million is larger than Alaska, Delaware, District of Columbia, Hawaii, Maine, Montana, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, and Wyoming.





Chart B – Suffolk County 2025 Recommended Operating Budget Expenditure

Suffolk County: At a Glance

Suffolk County comprises about 1000 square miles of the eastern two-thirds of Long Island. Long Island, formed during the Pleistocene Era 10,000 years ago, extends 120 miles into the Atlantic Ocean, east from New York City. The distance from the Nassau County border to the eastern tip of Montauk Point is 86 miles.

The Dutchman, Adrian Block, who was the first explorer to touch land at Montauk Point in 1614, encountered indigenous people. English colonists crossed Long Island Sound from Connecticut and Massachusetts colonies, founding Southold and Southampton (1640), East Hampton (1648), Shelter Island (1652), and Setauket in Brookhaven (1655).

In 1682 James, Duke of York, who owned Long Island, appointed Thomas Dongan to govern it. At a gathering of colonial representatives, the "Charter of Liberties and Privileges" was adopted (November 1683), establishing Suffolk County as a political entity and as one of the 12 original

counties of the Province of New York, and laying the foundation for the State's present political subdivisions and governmental structure.

Until 1960, Suffolk County, consisting of the ten towns of Babylon, Brookhaven, East Hampton, Huntington, Islip, Riverhead, Shelter Island, Smithtown, Southampton, and Southold, was governed by a Board of Supervisors, with each town represented by its elected supervisor. In 1958, the voters approved a new Suffolk County Charter that provided for a new administrative officer, the County Executive, while retaining the Board of Supervisors as the legislative body. In 1968, the US Supreme Court mandated that the one-man, one-vote principle be applied to county government. Therefore, the Charter Revision Commission proposed the apportionment of the county into 18 districts of equal population, and the election of one representative from each of the districts to constitute the County Legislature, replacing the old Board of Supervisors.
