## ***2026 Civic Contribution Awardees Chosen***

The LWVHC Board of Directors has chosen two awardees to receive the League's 2026 Civic Contribution Award -- Marilyn Tucker and Betty and Gene Senestraro.

Marilyn Tucker, of Arcata, has contributed hundreds of volunteer hours to the Friends of the Redwood Libraries over the past 38 years. Her work has helped make the group a vital resource for the Humboldt County Library. Elected to multiple board officer positions, Marilyn served as president or vice president for 12 years. She edited and published the Friends's newsletter for nearly 20 years. In addition, she was instrumental in the Children's Art Calendar, Children's Author Festival, and quarterly book sales, and she worked to get donated books into Humboldt County schools.

Betty and Gene Senestraro, of Eureka and formerly of Fortuna, have given their time and talent for 80 years of their adult lives to the betterment of Humboldt County's dairy and agricultural communities. Long-time dairy ranchers in Humboldt County, they are active volunteers in Italian heritage organizations and at St. Joseph's hospital -- Betty for 45 years and Gene for 30. Betty has been the consummate organizer and planner for the Eureka Women's Club and the Red Hat Ladies Club civic projects. Gene, through his service on the Farm Bureau Board, had a leading role in shaping Farm Bureau policy in postwar Humboldt County. He served on multiple regional and state Farm Bureau boards: the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board, the California Milk Advisory Board, the County Planning Commission, St. Bernard's Parish Finance Committee, the 4-H Leaders Council, and the Board of South Bay Elementary School District.

Marilyn Tucker and Betty and Gene Senestraro will receive their awards at the LWVHC's annual State of the Community Luncheon, April 10, 2026, at the Adorni Center in Eureka.

## ***Access Humboldt's Boot Camp for the Bold Day of Giving***

Access Humboldt is getting ready to start its Boot Camp for the Bold Day of Giving which happens May 29. Their goal is to have fifty non-profit 501(c)3 organizations participate this year to raise money for their own organizations. The Boot Camp begins February 5 and meets eight times in two-hour sessions through mid-May.

This training is an intensive program to help non-profits fundraise using story-based messaging. Members from organizations that participated last year were very impressed with all they learned and the money they raised. The League of Women Voters of Humboldt is currently a 501(c)4 organization and, as such, cannot participate. But if you are involved with other non-profits that are 501(c)3 organizations, encourage them to contact Access Humboldt to sign up for the Boot Camp and the Bold Day of Giving. The cost of the Boot Camp is on a sliding scale, based on the size of the organization.

Unfortunately, Congress just passed, and the President signed, HR 2289, a bill that makes even deeper cuts to the funding for public access programming, so fundraising will become even more important!

Access Humboldt has to move out of its CR location by May and is actively looking for a site with around 6000 square feet.
