### **Make Voting Safe!**

As public health concerns persist, the Ohio General Assembly must make improvements to absentee and early voting, so that no Ohioan is forced to choose between protecting their health and casting their ballot.

Senate Bill 191 is commonsense legislation to make our Absentee Voting system more efficient for voters and election officials, by allowing voters to request an absentee ballot online.

As we saw in the Primary, voting by mail in Ohio is inefficient, confusing, and cumbersome for voters and election officials alike. Countless Ohioans were cut out of the process through no fault of their own. SB 191 would allow voters to securely request their ballot online, but we also need other improvements: prepaid postage for ballots and applications, multiple drop boxes and Early Vote Centers per county, and more.

#### June 9, 2020

Following the Money: The History and Where We Are Now housing, education, healthcare, criminal justice and opportunity, nothing will change.

As Statehouse Minority Leader Emilia Sykes writes, "Racism can no longer be a burden people of color shoulder themselves. It is up to white people to check and acknowledge their privilege. We can offer conversations about the inequities facing communities of color, but until white communities truly look inside themselves and say "We would not want this for ourselves," we will not see any change."

LWV advocates a potent solution: Voting. We see safe, accessible elections that encourage participation and an informed citizenry as the most important tools we have to elect leaders that understand the need to effect meaningful change. We want to see commonsense election changes that will make voting easier and more accessible for all voters.

On Thursday, however, the Ohio House passed HB 680, <u>a bill that will make it much harder to vote</u>, especially for the poor and disadvantaged, in the event of an emergency like the pandemic. The bill arose out of the problems with the March / April primary election.

As written it prohibits the governor and department of health director from conducting an election other than as prescribed in the Ohio Revised Code. The legislation prescribes the same confusing all vote by mail process that occurred during the primary, made worse by explicitly prohibiting the Secretary of State from forwarding absentee ballot applications and ballots to voters with pre-paid postage.

Many of the most objectionable provisions of the original bill were dropped due to successful bipartisan lobbying efforts by voter rights groups like LWVO and Common Cause, as well as the Secretary

On June 16, 1919, Ohio ratified the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment. On June 16, 2020, LWVO will have the honor of sharing with you three amazing trailblazers:

Virginia Kase – current CEO LWVUS

Carolyn Jefferson-Jenkins – former LWVUS President and author of State and Boards of Election. These groups saw the legislation as an opportunity to ease voter participation and ensure a safe, accessible process that would be reasonable for Boards of Election to implement. HB now moves to the Senate and then onto the governor for his signature. During the testimony against the bill, Rep. Brigid Kelly said her office received thousands of calls in opposition. These were your calls! They do make a difference.

We are not going to be quiet when there are attempts to limit voting access. The League is initiating **Take Action Tuesdays**, a weekly call to action to contact legislators and share our views on priority issues for *Making Democracy Work*, i.e., on elections, gerrymandering, and money in politics. As one legislative aide told me earlier this week, "We don't often hear from voters." That's going to change with your help when we engage in **Take Action Tuesdays**.

#### On a Personal Note

This is my last message to you as president. It has been an honor to serve as president, but like you, I know I can't sit still. We face a challenging year ahead and our new president and board will need our full participation. Together we can make real change – we've done it before and we'll do it again.


