As we move ahead during these trying times, we would like to remind you of Unite and Rise 8.5. LWVUS' powerful new initiative to engage and mobilize 8.5 million people to preserve and protect democracy by rising non-violently against the anti-democratic actions recently taken by this administration. 8.5 million people is 3.5% of eligible voters in the United States. Research shows this is the number of people needed to bring about meaningful change. Please take a look at the Power Playbook for Unite and Rise on the LWVUS website for more specific information. ## Affordable Housing & Homeless Solutions (AH&HS) Deb Elzinga, Director of Community Frameworks

Community Frameworks (CF) celebrated their 50th Anniversary in 2024. That was a real surprise to our committee because we had only heard of them recently. It is a national organization that grew out of the EXPO 74's Environmental Symposium Series, which was based on the belief that it was critical for citizens to be involved in shaping the future of the institutions that affected their lives. Housing became the cornerstone of their work. Community Frameworks is one of four nation-wide organizations that act as a funding intermediary for HUD's Self-Help Homeownership Opportunity Program (SHOP). Their work has resulted in creating over 4,500 homeownership opportunities across the Pacific Northwest region. Here in Spokane, they have rehabbed 4,600 homes and now own 9 rental properties that serve over 500 people.

Deb began with the organization in 2017 and has seen a lot of changes over that time. They have been successful with their 9 rental properties. They consult with other non-profits developing affordable housing. They partner with banks to provide mortgages for low-income buyers. They offer Homebuyer Education and Counseling and on-site case workers to help support new homeowners. While their past suc-

cess has been life-changing for many of the residents of WA state, the current economic conditions are offering many more challenges. CF has successfully used the tax credit program to help garner

funding from businesses. Government policies have caused significant increases in the cost of property insurance, legal expenses and property repairs and maintenance. As a result, CF is looking at finding creative ways to increase funding, such as a fund-raising program, private banks, and philanthropic organizations. Deb encourages the LWVSA members to reach out to their elected officials to work to address deficiencies in zoning regulations, development restrictions, work to avoid urban sprawl and find financial incentives to promote development housing for the low- and middle-income households.

#### **Summer Outreach Activities**

Spring is here, we're on the verge of summer, and voter registration and outreach activities are in full swing!

Although four of our events in May (Cheney Mayfest, Brush on the Bluff, EWU's Basic Needs Resource Fair, and Spokane Valley Connect) only generated one newly registered voter, League volunteers made positive outreach to members of widely varying community groups.

Interest in the League was high at each event and many expressed their appreciation for the work the League does.

At the EWU and Spokane Valley events, we engaged in the national League's Unite and Rise 8.2 advocacy work regarding cuts to Medicaid. We urged attendees to contact their representatives who were voting on the budget bill. Many knew what was happening and were grateful for the TRYs we handed out and the timely alert we shared about the pending vote in the U.S. House of Representatives. We handed out a small flyer at EWU, but did not use the flyer at Spokane Valley opting instead to urge attendees to phone or email elected officials and show them where in the TRY brochure they could find contact information.
