High School Voter Education and Registration



High School NEW voter education and voter registration is here!

Each year the LWV Arlington and Alexandria City goes into Senior High School Social Studies classes to do a nonpartisan interactive presentation on the importance of voting. We talk about how your vote is your voice on issues that are important to you and how one vote can make a difference. As part of this presentation we also register students to vote. We will also be doing lunch time voter registration. We registered over 550 students during this drive last year. This is your opportunity to inspire young voters and help them build a lifetime habit of voting!

We are moving to sign-ups with SignUpGenius this year. Click on the high schools below to see the time slots available to sign up and when you find a time that works for you simply click on "sign up" and it will ask you for your name and email. Only your name will be visible on the SignUpGenius to others signing up. For the classroom presentations we would like to have experienced volunteers paired with newer volunteers. We have noted on the sign-up sheet slots for experienced versus new(er) volunteers. We will provide you with classroom information a week prior to volunteering along with additional logistics information. Please also sign up for the classroom training on Saturday, January 25, from 2-3:30pm at Arlington Central Library if you

are volunteering to do the classroom presentations (this training is not necessary if you are doing lunch time voter registration only).

Key facts on Transformation - Initiating on/about 1 February 2025:

If you missed the Transformation training provided on Tuesday, 7 January, email lwvarlingtonva@gmail.com and we'll send you a video.

(1) <u>Next Steps in the Process</u>: On or about the first week of February 2025, every member of LWVAAC will receive instructions to log into the new portal in ChapterSpot (the new membership platform). These instructions will guide you through the process of setting up your own ChapterSpot account. <u>Everyone</u> should create their own account when they receive that email within 24-72 hours.

Once <u>everyone</u> sets up their new individual membership account in accordance with the instructions received, a smaller group of members (*not all members*) will receive an automated renewal notice. These are people whose memberships are already scheduled to lapse on March 31, 2025. Again, not all members will receive a renewal notice in February. The vast majority of LWVAAC members will <u>not</u> be asked to renew their membership, or pay dues, at this time.

- (2) LWVAAC dues will go from \$60.00 to \$75.00 (sliding scale). No more household discount; however, you can use the sliding scale option to create your own household discount. Lifetime members still free. Students are no longer free, but a \$20.00 minimum is the low end of the sliding scale. Use a credit card or set up an ACH with your bank. A credit card or ACH can be set for automatic renewal. To date, LWVUS has not established a check processing system, so do not submit checks for dues.
- (3) Donations to LWVAAC are welcome and can be submitted via checks (mailed to our post office box) or via online payments through PayPal.

Finally - as we transition over, Lisa Backer will be available to answer questions and assist as needed. But in the future, membership issues should be directed to LWVUS.

Issue Group Advocacy Opportunity

Want to do some cool advocacy stuff at the state level in 2025?

Did you know that LWV-VA (our state-level LWV) has Issue Groups? These are groups formed from various members of local leagues around Virginia, such as Fairfax, Richmond, Hampton Roads, Prince William County, and, of course, Arlington & Alexandria City (LWVAAC). These Issue Groups (IGs) are formed around various topics, such as: Domestic Violence and Gun Control, Reproductive Freedom, Voting and Elections, Education and Child Care...and more! You can read about them here:

LWV-VA Issue Groups

Many of the issues important to LWV are discussed and acted on by the General Assembly in Richmond. That, in turn, creates the opportunity for local engagement. For example, before Arlington County adopted Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) for its County Board elections, the Virginia General Assembly had to approve the use of the RCV. The LWV-VA Voting & Elections Issue Group (IG) played a significant role in advocating for the passage of HB1103 by writing testimony for legislative hearings in Richmond, researching information on RCV, and writing talking points. That advocacy led to the passage of HB1103 in 2020. Once HB1103 passed in Richmond, the Arlington League engaged in local advocacy to persuade members of the Arlington County Board to adopt the use of RCV in County Board elections. Similarly, Charlottesville and other local Leagues are engaged in conversations with their local

governing bodies in order to persuade them to use RCV in local elections, thus helping to take RCV from an idea to a reality. [Check out the volunteer section below. This year we will be commencing our efforts once again locally: Onward to Alexandria!]

Issue Group efforts in Virginia put you directly in the space of advocating for important issues the League supports. And, the best part about it? You don't have to be an expert on the issue; you'll learn as you go! You'll meet League members across the state that share your interests and you'll build your knowledge base. If you're thinking about ways to become more involved, consider joining some of the Issue Groups in Virginia.
