This is in response to the rather frightening turn of events in this country, where people carrying out vital work permitting free and fair access to the polls are being threatened!

We will be visiting both the Arlington Registrar's Office, 2100 Clarendon Blvd and the Alexandria Office at 132 N Royal, Suite 100, Alexandria. Due to construction in Arlington, we won't know the exact location in Bozman until closer to the event.

At both locations we are expected to arrive at 11;30 AM on April 12.

What do we do when we get there? **We bring thank you cards, banners,** food – to thank and cheer the election workers. Be sure to take pictures because there will a nationwide social media campaign #ELECTIONHEROESDAY





Federal Court Strikes Down Florida Voter Suppression Law (Senate Bill 90)

3/31/2022

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — A US federal court struck down key provisions of Florida's Senate Bill 90 that equated to voter suppression. Chief U.S. District Judge Mark E. Walker ruled that Florida's Senate Bill 90 violates federal law, unconstitutionally impeding the right to vote for Floridians. He noted that "the right to vote, and the VRA particularly, are under siege."
