I am so pleased to announce that we have the final numbers for the joint League efforts to register new citizens. We registered 2295 new citizens and all leagues involved contributed 556 volunteer hours. Of those hours, 135.5 hours or 24% were given by Arlington- Alexandria City LWV members! That is the highest number of hours donated outside of the LWV Fairfax which sponsored the program!

There are plans to continue this program in 2023, so stay tuned. Thank you!

Another big thanks to the four people (**Lisa Backer**, **Cathleen Phelps**, **Alice Moore**, **Sandra Hogue**), who stepped up to be trained in Membership to assist with this program!

The coalition, called the Arlington Community Reentry Coalition is made up of representatives of various agencies in Arlington who work in support of recently released former convicts to the Arlington community. The coalition incorporates a variety of social agencies including the local police department, public defender's office, Catholic Charities, Spread the Vote, AFAC and AHC along with the League and others.

We will be providing information on the restoration of rights and voting information, (of course). They are planning a fair on Feb 18 for families or incarcerated people and returning citizens and which we will have a booth.
