
Dialog on Race and Equity

Governor's Challenge and High School Voter Registration

LWV Virginia is once again taking the lead supporting the "Governor's Challenge." **High** schools across the Commonwealth will have the opportunity to compete to register the highest percentage of their voting-age population. Schools that reach or exceed 65 percent registration of their eligible senior class will receive a congratulatory certificate from the Governor.

The Governor's Challenge was created in 2016 and is a partnership of the Office of the Governor and the Virginia Secretaries of Administration and Education, in collaboration with the Virginia Department of Elections, and the League of Women Voters of Virginia.





Dr. Brenna Wynn Greer will trace how Black public relations guru **Moss Hyles Kendrix** enlisted white corporate America in a campaign to redefine black citizenship after World War II. Dr. Greer will also examine how Kendrix and his work—so visible and so important in the early Cold War era—was almost lost to us. **Dr. Greer** is Associate Professor of History at Wellesley College, and her first book *Represented: The Black Imagemakers Who Reimagined African American Citizenship*(University of Pennsylvania Press), is now available for purchase.


How to Engage in Federal Advocacy for the For the People Act

Earlier this month, the House of Representatives reintroduced H.R. 1 or the For the People Act. This bill comprises a bold, transformative set of reforms to strengthen our democracy and return political power to the people. A House vote on the For the People Act is expected to take place in the next couple of weeks. For anyone hoping to help advocate for the passage of this bill, LWVUS has put together a comprehensive toolkit that includes sample social media posts and graphics, letter to the editor

ACTION ALERT - New Hope for the ERA



This month, the House and Senate introduced legislation to remove the time limit on the Equal Rights Amendment and finally include it in our Constitution! The League has supported ratification of the ERA since it was first passed by Congress in 1972, and we have worked for decades to see ratification by the states.

Last year, Virginia ratified the ERA, bringing the total state count to the required 38. Now it is time for the legislative branch to pass it and finally include women in the U.S.

Constitution.

Absentee Voting practices bills pass in General Assemby



Congratulations, Virginia voters! The Virginia Senate has passed **SB1245** and the House passed **HB1888**, making permanent the absentee ballot drop off and curing provisions from the general election in November. We look forward to final passage of this legislation.

The Commonwealth is well on its way to climbing lists of good voting practices again.
