Happy New Year! We're looking forward to another year of doing what we do best: voter registration and supporting democracy.



Top-of-mind for us right now is our migration to the new LWVUS system for membership and dues scheduled for 1 February. We are having a LWVAAC-wide training via Zoom on **Tuesday**, **7 January at 7:00pm**. You are encouraged to come to the training to learn the details of the changes coming (including tax implication changes).

<u>LWVAAC 2025 Transformation Dues Structure Meeting Sign-Up</u>

For those content with a bottom-line approach without the detail, here's what you need to know:

- (1) LWVAAC dues will go from \$60.00 to \$75.00 (sliding scale). No more household discount; no more free students (minimum \$20.00 payment). Lifetime members still free.
- (2) On or about the first week of February 2025, every member with an active (unexpired) membership and an individual email in our system will receive instructions to log into the new portal in ChapterSpot (the new membership platform). Every League member will thereby have access to their membership account information, including expiration date, in order to pay dues and update their information. Members will receive an email from ChapterSpot 60 days prior to their membership expiration date, then again 30 days prior, to be reminded to pay their dues. Members will handle this directly and not via LWVAAC's email system.
- (3) Dues payments via check is still being worked out. We encourage our members to take this opportunity to change over to online payment; however, if you're uncomfortable with that, you can still pay by check. More information will follow.
- (4) For now and into the near future, we ask that any donations you would like to make to LWVAAC be accomplished separately and not be added to your dues. We will continue to take donations via checks (mailed to our post office box) or via online payments through PayPal.

Who's Breaking the News? A Discussion on the State of Local Media and Why it Matters

The loss of local newspapers accelerated in 2023, leaving more than 200 counties as "news deserts" and meaning that more than half of all U.S. counties now have limited access to reliable local news and information.

In Arlington, Arlnow recently acquired the Gazette Leader which had acquired the Sun Gazette, a longstanding local publication. Join Advance Arlington on Wednesday, January 8, 2025 at 6:30pm, in-person at Arlington Central Library (1015 North Quincy Street, Arlington VA 22201) and virtually via Zoom to explore how our local media coverage is changing and the impact it has on good government, community engagement, and local culture with Scott Brodbeck and Lauren Victoria Burke.



Scott Brodbeck is the founder and CEO of Local News Now, which owns and operates three hyperlocal news websites — ARLnow, ALXnow, and FFXnow — covering Arlington, Alexandria and Fairfax County in Northern Virginia. LNN also partners with other D.C. area local news sites, including PoPville and MoCoShow. A former TV news writer and producer with an MBA from Georgetown University and a BA from George Washington University, Brodbeck was a founding board member of Local Independent Online News

Publishers (LION). He lives in Arlington with his wife and two kids, who attend Jamestown Elementary.

Lauren Victoria Burke has enjoyed a diverse career in journalism and politics for over 25 years. Her first big job in journalism was as assistant to Cokie Roberts at ABC News. She then went on to work for USAToday, The Hill, AP and The Guardian. Ms. Burke has also worked in politics in New York and Virginia serving as a Communications Director on Capitol Hill and for Virginia's 41st Lt. Gov. Justin Fairfax. She founded Black Virginia News in 2022 and appears on Roland Martin Unfiltered every Thursday. She is a graduate of The American University.

High School Voter Registration Winter 2025

We are gearing up for High School Voter Registration effort starting in February! Notices will be forthcoming shortly for folks to sign up. You'll want to attend the training event below.

High School Classroom Registration Training

Mark your calendars for Saturday, 25 January 2:00 – 3:30pm; Arlington Central Library (1015 N. Quincy Street, Arlington).

Last year we registered over 550 students when we went into US government and other senior social studies classes to talk about the importance of voting and to register students to vote. We are working on finalizing the dates of when we will be in the classrooms but it will be most of the month of February. Similar to past years we will also do lunch time voter registration outside cafeterias on the days we are in classrooms. So we need lots of help with this effort!

LWVAAC Voter Services will conduct a training for everyone participating in high school classroom presentations on **25 January from 2:00-3:30**. The classroom has been updated to focus on state offices since that is what is on the ballot next year. New and experienced volunteers are encouraged to attend.

More information will follow in early January along with the dates for the high schools classroom presentations and lunch voter registration sessions.
