E. Dick Howard is the Warner-Booker Distinguished Professor of International Law at the University of Virginia.

# This is going to be a busy year for us in terms of voter services.

We will have a **June 20 primary** that will be done via Ranked Choice Voting for Arlington County Board and "regular voting" for other offices. **Voters will receive two ballots** and we will have to inform them about how ballots should be cast. Also, **we will be voting this year on the newly redrawn districts**. So, we will have to get our voter education hats on for sure.

### **Arlington Elections Timetable**

**March 20** – the first day candidates can file for the June 20 primary

**April 6** – the deadline for candidate applications.

May 5 - first day of in-person early voting

**May 30** – last day to register to vote or update your existing registration

**June 9** – 5pm – last day to apply for mail ballot.

June 20 – primary day

### Alexandria City.

Alexandria elects its mayor and six-member City Council every third year. The next election for Mayor and City Council will be on

Tuesday, November 5, 2024. School Board elections are held the first Tuesday in November of even-numbered years in conjunction with state general elections.

We will have to see if there are any primary challenges for members of the Virginia Legislature to from Alexandria City, to know if there will be a primary.

Same day voter registration is still in effect – meaning people can register to vote after May 30 – and file a provisional ballot. We can NOT register people to vote same day – it must be done at polling sites and at the registrar's offices.

Also, people will still need to get a witness for mail in ballots for the June primary.

Arlington County has launched a broadband study to better understand its community's internet use and broadband access. As a part of this work, Arlington is asking both residents and businesses to participate in a digital eCheckup.

Arlington County is launching this study as part of its effort to make sure residents have affordable, reliable access to high-speed internet. **Take the digital eCheckup now**, and then share the link with a neighbor!

**This study takes about 20 minutes** to complete. Know that by participating you are acting to support LWV US and LWV VA positions. the June 2022 LWV National Convention adopted the concurrence proposed by the LWV Rural Caucus and backed by 52 state and local Leagues. The concurrence

allows Leagues at any level to advocate for affordable broadband everywhere, as well as for access to public, educational and governmental (PEG) access media."
