Provide Input on Statewide Vote411 Questions

Now that the presidential primary is over, it's time to think about the rest of the year's elections! The League of Women Voters of Virginia is seeking feedback on Vote411 questions for candidates in this year's U.S. Congress races. Typically LWV-VA requires that all local leagues use a couple of statewide questions, with the option to choose from a list of supplemental questions and/or write questions that are tailored to their local areas. LWV-VA's draft questions are as follows:

- What steps should be taken by Congress to address the high cost of living and depressed wages in Virginia, including for families, people with disabilities, and people that are economically disadvantaged?
- 2. What steps will you take to ensure all Virginians have access to quality and affordable health care, including reproductive care and prescription drug coverage?
- 3. What will you do to support an economy and job market that are strong and inclusive of all people?
- 4. What are the most important steps you will take to create an accessible path to citizenship, including Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients?
- 5. What measures do you support to expand voter access and restore trust in our elections?
