# **Letter to the Editor - Washington Post**

Virginia residents shouldn't lose heart. Unlike that of other states, Virginia's gerrymandering typically protected the incumbents of either party. This type of gerrymandering fundamentally allowed elected representatives to pick their own voters rather than the voters picking their own representatives.

Though this current political environment makes things difficult for the commission, the intent behind the 2020 redistricting reform is still a solid move

toward a healthier democracy where citizens are a relevant part of this process. Nearly two-thirds of Virginians from all across the commonwealth voted in favor of this reform; they were right to do so so that the voters can have the say they are entitled to rather than the other way around.
