A Message From the President

Dear Members.

You've heard about the voter purge.

More than 180,000 Ohio voters were recently removed from the voter rolls at the direction of the Secretary of State. Most were removed due to deaths, household moves and infrequent voting (no voting for six years). But in the imperfect purge process, many voters were improperly removed.

On Friday, September 28 the Akron Chapter of the NAACP contacted us to assist in making calls to voters whose voter registration was purged. Three days later the lists were distributed and calls were in progress informing voters they need to re-register by October 7 to be eligible to vote in the November 5 election. Seventeen members raised their hands to help with this short turnaround request. Thank you all for helping to ensure voters who want to vote, can vote.

Ohio's voter purge, a process that was upheld by the US Supreme Court in 2018, is flawed and is just one area of Ohio's election system that needs to be modernized. It shouldn't be difficult for citizens' to exercise their right to vote. Senate Bill 186 cosponsored by Nathan Manning (R) and Vernon Sykes (D) is a good start.

During license and identification transactions at the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles eligible Ohio citizens would automatically be registered to vote or have their registration updated, unless they decline. This legislation could go a long way toward updating the voting rolls as address and other changes occur.

Hudson Climate Investigation Series

Laurel Lake Community Retirement Center 200 Laurel Lake Dr, Hudson, OH 44236 LWV Hudson is hosting a community engagement series of four workshops designed to develop informed policy recommendations for Hudson that will foster safety and sustainabililty in this time of climate change.

You've seen the ads scaring us into believing the Chinese will take over our energy infrastructure if we sign "their" petition. Ohioans for Energy Security is a dark money organization that supports preserving HB 6, the bill signed into law that will charge all Ohioans \$.85 / month toward underwriting First Energy Solutions' aging nuclear and coal plants. Their campaign is trying to make it difficult for Ohioans Against Corporate Bailouts, an organization underwritten primarily by the natural gas industry, to circulate its referendum petitions that seek to rescind the law.

LWVO has not taken a position on the referendum. But the League is concerned about the influence of dark money in our election system and the HB6 ad campaign is a sordid example. If we don't know the sources behind influence campaigns like this one, we can't properly assess the bias in their arguments. We need to be able to expose the sources of large contribution amounts to deter corruption. Please follow the suggestions highlighted in LWVO's October 2 Action Alert to raise your concerns with your legislators and the community.

LWVAA 2019 Voter Registration Program improved by 31%

Eleven Registration Event Leaders and 22 member-volunteer Registrars staffed 24 venues for a total of 232 volunteer hours this summer, registering new voters and updating the registration of others. Our 330 total number of registrations is a 31% increase over last year's 252 registrations.

We attribute our increased effectiveness to our new Event Leader Corps, our focused attention to venue selection, and the commitment of our members who signed up repeatedly to support this mission.

2020 Census Update

The 2020 Complete Census Count Committee met for their quarterly meeting on September 17, 2019. Liz King is the LWVAA representative to the Committee and one of 28 members who represent governmental agencies, social service organizations and other community groups.

These Committees have been formed all over the country to facilitate a full count in the 2020 Census. The City of Akron and Summit County have been instrumental in spearheading this effort. A Coordinator has just been hired through joint funding to assist

with the Committee efforts.

Nineteen subcommittees have been formed to intensify the promotion of Census information and to encourage full participation. The US Census Bureau will be hiring 2,000 regional census takers in the coming months.

The 2020 Census results will affect Federal and State funded programs, reapportionment and redistricting decisions, civil rights programs, research and planning efforts as well as business decision making. Every effort must be made to have an accurate and complete count.
