Reflect | Lighting a New Fire


In early 2017, students from Akron, Cleveland, and Kent contributed their ideas for how Northeast Ohio could celebrate the Cuyahoga River's renewal 50 years after the infamous 1969 fire. "We should show everyone that we strive for higher than our expectations," wrote a Summit Academy student.

Out of six community listening sessions bubbled the idea of a torch relay connecting festivals from the headwaters to Cleveland. This dream became a reality June 19-22 when hundreds of partners came together to create numerous Cuyahoga50 and Xtinguish Torch Fest events.

People here get that the health of our waterways is a metaphor for the health of our communities. We cannot move forward until we demonstrate to ourselves, the nation, and the world that old punchlines no longer apply. The return of pollution-sensitive wildlife to the Cuyahoga was unimaginable when the US EPA wrote its state of the environment report in 1980.

Now Ohio EPA studies show that our once-"dead" river supports more than 70 kinds of fish. This has attracted bald eagles, otters, great blue herons—and people.

As we look to the next 50 years, consider how we can keep moving forward, igniting our common future. Imagine vibrant communities, united by water, benefiting all.

Hear the remarkable story of this fearless female who spent her life doing things that women in her time didn't do, including being the first woman to run for President - in 1872! Victoria Woodhull ran for president under the banner of The Equal Rights Party. She supported universal suffrage for women, an eight-hour workday, a national education system, and the creation of an international body to help prevent war around the world!

Legislative Update

After a 17-day delay we have a State budget. A few highlights and lowlights:

- While failing to fix our school funding system, the budget did include an infusion of cash for wraparound services in our public schools
- A joint legislative body that provides oversight for education was abolished, charter school regulations were reduced, and more taxpayer money will go to private, mostly religious schools via vouchers
- Lawmakers made education policy by creating new graduation requirements but punted for a year on fixing the controversial process of state school takeovers
- The budget expands the Housing Trust Fund and dedicates one-time money to Lake Erie water quality and the mitigation of the effects of farm runoff
- The required number of precinct poll workers was reduced. This comes at a time when many Ohio counties will be introducing new voting machines in 2019-2020.
- \$7.5 million will go to disreputable and medically unsound crisis pregnancy centers. Additionally, a program that would have reduced the number of unwanted (or "crisis") pregnancies by providing long acting contraceptives to low-income women who rely on Medicaid was killed.

And House Bill 6 passed.

The legislation will add a new charge on utility bills to fund a \$150 million per year bailout of two failing nuclear power plants and two coal plants, while unwinding the state's renewable energy and efficiency standards--making Ohio the first state to do so.


Despite the above outcomes, those of you who contacted your legislators in opposition to elements of the budget and HB6 are heroes! Due to the opposition to HB6 it took the legislature three weeks beyond First Energy's drop-dead decision date to get it passed, and, not incidentally, more contributions to key decision-maker's campaigns. ("FirstEnergy PAC handed out \$1M in campaign cash before nuke bailout," ABJ, 7.29.2019).
