Candidates respond to questions posed by the League – we do no editing.



Tired of paper voter forms and low registration capture rates? Join special guest, State Senator Vernon Sykes in a discussion facilitated by Rosanne Winter on Automatic Voter Registration at our All-Member Meeting.

What is AVR? It's a simplified method for registering voters when they interact with a government agency. With AVR, when an eligible citizen interacts with an agency like the BMV to apply for a new or updated driver's license or ID, the citizen will be automatically registered to vote unless they affirmatively decline. And, importantly, the person's identifying information will be electronically transferred to the Board of Elections.

According to the Brennan Center for Justice, 16 states have already adopted AVR and 39 states either enacted AVR or introduced AVR legislation in 2019. Senator Sykes and Senator Nathan Manning have introduced a bipartisan bill that would be a first step towards AVR. Bring your questions. Friends welcome, too! Continue the conversation over wine and nibbles at Crave, just a short block away.

# October Candidate Forum Recap

LWVAA welcomed 18 Akron candidates and the community to the Candidate Forum held at the Akron-Summit County Public Library in downtown Akron October 15. Ward candidates visited informally with their constituents; municipal court judicial candidates presented timed statements about their candidacy; and moderated question and answer sessions were conducted with City Council-at-Large and Akron School Board candidates.

We were grateful for the help and support received from our co-sponsors, the Akron chapters of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority and the NAACP. Many thanks go to LWVAA Forum Committee members Kay Clark, Jackie Derrow, Barbara Hunsicker, Gloria Irwin, Mary Ann Jopperi, Kim Nelson, Michelle Mostow and Susan Ross for their work on planning, publicizing and facilitating the event.

# **Legislative Updates**

Many bills of interest to the League have been making their way through the legislative process. Below is a sample of the bills LWVO has been tracking over the past month. For a full listing, see the <u>LWV Ohio Legislative Tracker</u>.

#### **Elections & Voting**

**SB 194**, which includes a number of measures that would make voter registration systems more secure, has also had regular hearings throughout October. The League has been a strong supporter of this bill and has worked with Senator Rulli to ensure the strongest version of this bill passes.

**SB 52**, which will create the civilian cyber security reserve forces and requires election results to be audited (among other security measures) passed the House and was signed into law by the Governor.

#### **Environment**

**HB 202**, which would establish the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Study Committee, had its fourth hearings in the House Transportation and Public Safety Committee.


**HB 7**, which would create the H2Ohio Trust Fund for the protection and preservation of Ohio' water quality, passed the House in June and had its first hearing in the Senate Finance Committee on October 22.

**SB 222**, which would prohibit the imposition of a tax or fee on the use of disposable containers/bags, was introduced in October and referred to the Senate Local Government Committee. A similar bill was voted out of committee in the House – House Bill 242 – in June.

#### **Women and Families**

**SB 146**, would expand the offense of domestic violence to also prohibit a person from chocking a family or household member, had its third hearing in the Senate Judiciary on October 2 in the Senate Judiciary Committee.

**House Bill 19**, which will exempt feminine hygiene products from sales tax, was incorporated into SB 26 - now a tax omnibus bill that also gives teachers a tax break on school supply purchases and allows lobbyists and attorneys to apply for the small business tax deduction.



## **Centennial Corner**

LWVAA is one of many community organizations that have come together under County Executive Ilene Shapiro's leadership to share ideas and events that educate and involve the public in the Women's Suffrage Movement's history. #### **LWVAA 2020 Women's Vote Centennial**

The Summit County Centennial Committee has formed three subcommittees and LWVAA is on the Culminating Activity Subcommittee. Our Centennial Committee is focusing on the program for that activity and invited Leianne Neff-Heppner, Head of the Summit County Historical Society to our October meeting.

Our discussion with Leianne focused on ideas and resources for program content. Those resources included, among others, The Women's History Project, the book "Politics and Women of Summit County" by Linda Frye and Cheryl Urban, The Ohio Women's Hall of Fame, and the website blog.uakron.edu/womenshistory.

The committee will continue to refine the program content and delivery method.
