RESTRUCTURING

Our youth voter registration for 2019-2020 began with a restructuring of administration the

program. At our July committee meeting, coordination of high school registration was divided among League members from Benicia, Fairfield, and Vacaville. Each city (including Vallejo) will have their own coordinator who will oversee and schedule in-class presentations and tabling at the various high schools.

Gayle Vaughan will continue as Voter Service chair and work directly with schools in Benicia and Vallejo. Barbara King and Carole Paterson will handle the schools in Fairfield-Suisun, Becky Cecena will be organizing presentations for the Vacaville area, and Marilee Scholl is our representative for Solano Communi

If you have been active in our youth registration program in the past, expect a call from one of our coordinators this month. We will be registering youth voters from August, 2019 through January 2020 and from August, 2020 through October, 2020. We will start If you would like to join in helping our program, please consider attending the training session explained below.

We will kick off this registration season with a training session on Aug. 19, 10am-12pm, at the Fairfield Civic Center Library. We will be showing our newly updated power point presentation, discussing civic instructions, and the March primary. Solano County Assistant Registrar of Voters, John Gardner will be demonstrating changes in the actual voting process with some new machines. This year our plan is to create a strong foundation for our League throughout Solano County that will enable us to build:

- A strong, diverse, and inclusive base of members.
- Influencer relationships with values-based community organizations focused on engagement in government / elections.
- Awareness and recognition of LWV as a valuable resource for unbiased information and an organization that makes a real difference.



A key part of our plan is to build a pilot annual "*Democracy Matters*" *High School Civic Speech Scholarship Program* modeled on the highly successful program piloted by Alameda LWV and our new member Alice Fried. Alice has volunteered to lead this exciting project for our League! Working with Solano Community College, high schools, and other community organizations this program will be foundational in spreading LWV "roots" throughout the county.

We work hand in hand with our Voter Services and Program Planning teams to support their efforts and build our membership.

The Membership Committee is also working with Solano Community College (SCC) to encourage students to join the League (student memberships are free) at each campus starting during the fall semester Welcome Week (August 12-16). Then, throughout the year on a regular basis, we have SCC permission to staff a League table for recruiting LWV members and registering voters. Our SCC liaison Rischa Slade, the Associated Students Advisor, will provide us with guidance on the days and hours when peak traffic is likely at each campus.

Our experienced League members will work with our new student members with the goal of having student members eventually manage the program. 


GREAT DECISIONS EXTENSION SERIES continues fourth Mondays at 7:00 PM

We look at upcoming discussion topics, often including the reading of a book or articles about a particular subject at the end of each monthly meeting and generally make a decision about our next topic. Input is also gathered from online submissions.

At our regular July meeting we will be discussing the Mueller report. We suggested at a minimum that people read the summaries that Mueller and his staff prepared to be released to the public.
