Annual dues became due at the Annual Membership Meeting. If you attended the meeting and paid your dues thank you so much!! If you

did not attend the Annual Membership Meeting or attended but have not paid your dues you may pay by sending a check or checks to LWV Benicia, P.O. Two options for paying your 2019-2020 dues:

The simple way: Write a single check to the League of Women Voters Benicia

To get a partial tax deduction: Write two separate checks:

Single member: \$47. to LWV Benicia2-in-1 household: \$70.50 to LWF Benicia

\$22. To LWV Benicia Ed Fund \$34.50 to LWV Benicia Ed Fund

Money donated to the League of Women Voters Benicia is not tax deductible because we are a 501 (c)(4), a classification under the IRS code that allows us to do advocacy and lobbying. Though this classification is a non-profit, (ie: we do not have to pay taxes on our income), donations are not tax deductible. We do have a 501 (c)(3) entity, The League of Women Voter's Benicia Education Fund. Money donated to the League of Women Voters' Benicia Education Fund is tax deductible and can only be used for educational activities. The LWVUS and the LWVCA have determined the portion of their activities supported by your dues which qualify for tax deductible status and therefore only allow a portion of your dues to be paid into our education fund.

Most of our dues (nearly 90%) goes to support the LWVUS, the LWVCA, with a small amount (\$2.00) going to support the work of our regional organization, the League of Women Voters Bay Area. Both the national and state organizations of the League are very active in advocacy, lobbying and legal action to further our advocacy priorities. A recent example of the type of work the League supports can be found in the recent federal court decision regarding Ohio's Congressional Map (see NY Times, Saturday, May 4, 2019). The court threw out current district lines because "the dominant party in state government manipulated district lines in an attempt to control electoral outcomes and thus direct the political ideology of the state's congressional delegation." Ohio's map, in effect since 2012 has solidified a congressional delegation that has remained unchanged in four elections, with 12 Republicans and 4 democrats, or 75% for one party in what is a swing state. The court has ordered redistricting be completed in time for the 2020 election. The LWV Ohio was party to the suit brought that is affecting this changed. State leagues and the National League have been involved in a number of similar successful lawsuits.

To see all the ways that our state organization is involved in advocacy go to LWVC.org, the state website and review the 59 pages of the LWVCA Bill Status Report. This is a listing of every piece of state legislation on which the League has taken a position. Bills are listed in categories alphabetically from Air Quality, Campaign Finance, Child Care, Children and Families, Climate Change ... through Redistricting, Selection of the President, State and Local Finance, Violence Prevention, Voting Rights, and Water. Each bill is listed with a link to the text of the bill, there is a status report that delineates exactly where the bill is currently. The bill is summarized, the League position is stated, and action taken to support or oppose the legislation is listed with links to letters and other materials sent regarding bills.

New legislative priorities for 2019 have been set and the issues which we chose as our top three - housing, Voter protection, education and mobilization, and campaign finance reform (Money in Politics) - are all on their short list!!!!


