

LWVB Dues due at Annual Meeting 5/16/19

Annual dues are due at Annual Membership Meeting 5/16/19. If you joined earlier this year you do not need to renew at this time.

2019-2020: Full member \$70 Two-member household \$105

Two options for paying your 2019-2020 dues:

The simple way: Write a single check to the League of Women Voters Benicia

To get a partial tax deduction: write two separate checks:

Single member: \$47 to LWV Benicia 2-in-1 household: \$70.50 to LWV Benicia

\$22 to LWVB Ed Fund \$34.50 to LWVB Ed Fund

Money donated to the League of Women Voter's Benicia is not tax deductible because we are a 501 (c)(4). We do have a 501 (c)(3) fund: the League of Women Voter's Benicia Education fund.

Money donated to the League of Women Voter's Benicia's Education Fund is tax deductible, but can only be used for educational activities. The LWVUS and the LWVCA have determined the portion of their activities supported by your dues which qualify for tax deductible status and therefore only allow a portion of your dues to be paid into our educational fund.
