Thanks also to the volunteers who delivered VOTE! Yard signs and held texting parties, contacting all of the young people who registered in the last two years, reminding them to vote.



LWV Benicia Fiscal Report

The League of Women Voters Benicia is in a strong position fiscally. Our balance as of September 15, 2018, is \$7,116.64. We have currently paid all our per member obligations to the LWVUS, LWVCA and the LWV BA for 2018 - 2019 for a total of \$2387.



We secured approximately \$1500 in profits from our June nearly annual garage sale. If you would like to coordinate this sale next year please volunteer now!!!

Thanks to the hard work of Gayle Vaughan and the Voter Services Committee the League secured a \$1000 grant from the League of Women Voters US Education Fund this year to fund voter registration activities for local high schools. For more details on their spectacular work see the article in this newsletter.

The Voter Services committee adopted a poll during the June Primary and members donated a total of \$575 of the money they earned back to the LWV Benicia. The League is again adopting a poll for the November midterm election and we anticipate again that the League will receive some funds from members who work the polls. This is a great fundraiser for the League and an important service to the community.

We have received a \$500 donation for voter services from the Crockett Foundation in consideration of our assistance, coordinated by Belinda Smith, in their bi-annual board elections.

We are grateful to the Benicia Public Library for co-sponsoring a number of events with us including our Great Decisions meetings and candidate and proposition forums.

We are thankful for the work of Constance Beutel who has provided video of a number of our meetings for distribution to public access television.
