Important Laws

Section 7-1-25: Defines domicile or acceptable types of residence to use for registration.

*(6) a voter's address utilized for educational purposes, such as public school assignment and determination of tuition at institutions of higher education.

Section 7-5-120: Explains who can and who can not register to vote.

*(3) is convicted of a felony or offenses against the election laws, unless the disqualification has been removed by service of the sentence, including probation and parole time unless sooner pardoned.

Important Laws Cont.

- Section 7-5-150: Explains how voter registration books are closed thirty days before an election. Also partly covers seventeen year olds registering to vote if they turn eighteen on or before election day.
- Section 7-5-155: Explains the processes of registering by mail (which includes voter outreach) as well as how registration forms can be rejected.
- Section 7-5-180: Mostly builds upon 7-5-150 in terms of seventeen year olds being able to register to vote.

Important Laws Cont.

- Section 7-5-185: Covers registering electronically including online registration and registering through offices like the DMV.
- **Section 7-5-210:** Physically disabled persons may execute forms by mark.
