# It's about fair representation

Every ten years, the results of the Census are used to reapportion the 435 seats in the House of Representatives





#### It's in the Constitution

The U.S. Constitution mandates that EVERYONE in the country be counted every ten years. The first Census was held in 1790.

# Census data are being used all around you




By citizen groups to support community initiatives, advocate for federal resources, and to inform and quality-of-life issues


### It's about \$675 billion

The Census guides the distribution of \$675 billion in funds for over 50 federal programs—for roads, mass transit, schools, healthcare, and nutrition programs





By local governments to plan for public safety and emergency services



By businesses to know where to locate retail stores, offices, and manufacturing / service sites.
