

VOTING IN PERSON BEFORE ELECTION DAY



HOW DO I VOTE IN PERSON BEFORE ELECTION DAY?

Go to your city or township clerk's office, complete an application for an absentee ballot and submit it to the staff, then complete your ballot, place it in the envelope provided, sign the outside of the envelope with your official signature, and submit it to the staff.

WHEN CAN I VOTE IN PERSON BEFORE ELECTION DAY?

You can go to your city or township clerk's office starting 40 days before Election Day (June 23 for the primary and September 29 for the general election).

If you are already registered to vote where you live, the deadline to vote in person before Election Day is 4 p.m. on the Monday before Election Day (August 1 for the primary and November 7 for the general election).

If you need to register to vote, the deadline to register and vote at your city or township clerk's office is 8 p.m. on Election Day (August 2 for the primary and November 8 for the general election).

WHERE IS MY CITY OR TOWNSHIP CLERK'S OFFICE AND WHEN IS IT OPEN?

Visit the Michigan Voter Information Center michigan.gov/vote and enter your address to find the information for your city or township clerk. If your city or township clerk operates a satellite office or offices, the hours and locations of those offices will be posted as well. Alternatively, you can call your city or township clerk's office and ask for their hours and location(s).

City and township clerks' offices must be open during their normal hours, for at least eight hours the weekend before each election (July 30-31 for the primary and November 5-6 for the general election), and from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day (August 2 for the primary and November 8 for the general election).
