

On Wednesday, September 3, from 7:30-8:45 pm, LWVDV will host a panel discussion with local elected officials on "The Impact of Federal Cuts on Our Local Communities". They will discuss DOGE and BBB's impact on local health, education, and social services. The event will be held in the Oak Room of the Walnut Creek Library, 1644 N. Broadway, Walnut Creek, and is free to the public with advanced RSVP to unite.rise@lwvdv.org

These activities are part of a national effort to mobilize 8.5 million people through civic engagement, education and collective power. LWVDV's Unite & Rise team plans to participate in monthly rallies or similar events, and will hold a substantive information event once a quarter. If practical, the group will also do postcard campaigns.


The Challenges to Voting Rights Then and Now

September Community Conversation webinar Thursday, September 18, 2025 1:00 pm (NOTE Time change)

LWVUS President Dianna Wynn will join this panel along with a member of the production company of the musical SUFFs, which will be performed in San Francisco in October, and hopefully a key Federal legislator from California who will round out this powerful webinar in September. Contra Costa Librarian Alison Peters will moderate the discussion.

The panelists will focus on the history and obstacles the suffragists faced in passing the 19th Amendment, the founding of the League and its commitment to insure the right to vote, the driving force and commitment of the SUFFS production to bring this to life on stage, and the threats posed by the upcoming vote in the Senate on the SAVE Act legislation, especially to women.



A Conversation with
Professor Akhil Amar
Monday, October 13th (Time to be confirmed)
St Mary's College, Claeys Room

Professor Akhil Amar, Yale constitutional scholar, will discuss his **new book**, **Born Equal**: **Remaking America's Constitution**, **1840–1920**, which explores the transformative amendments that redefined freedom, equality, and voting rights in the post–Civil War era. At a moment when there are multiple challenges to our Constitution, this conversation with Dr. Amar is timely.

Amar, cont'd. St. Mary's College and Community Conversations -- a partnership of the League of Women Voters Diablo Valley and West Contra Costa County, the Contra Costa County Library, and CCTV -- host this event. Professor Emeritus Stephen Woolpert will moderate the conversation. A book sale and signing will follow the program.

I quickly put down the homemade banana bread I was snacking on. I was sitting in the City of Concord's community room on a bright Saturday morning in May. With me were about thirty-five members from the League of Women Voters of Diablo Valley around tables at our annual meeting. An additional dozen participants on the Zoom screen facing us in the room looked at Janet, our speaker sounding the alarm.

Janet explained, "For the first time in its 105-year history, the League of Women Voters (LWV) has determined that our

nation is in a constitutional crisis." The whack, whack, whack of the pickleball courts outside was muted as we absorbed this dire warning about the state of our democracy.

"The national League has defined a constitutional crisis when the executive, legislative or judiciary branches cannot or will not adequately protect the Constitution," she continued, "when any level of the federal government takes actions to destroy democratic institutions."




Out and About in the Community

Celebrating Our Partner, the Contra Costa Elections Department!

The following information comes from this past month's Elections Newsletter. As Contra Costa voters, we are fortunate to have an elections office that is a leader in establishing values and standards for free and fair elections. Congratulations, and thank you to all the county elections staff for your dedication and commitment.

"The Contra Costa County Elections Division has been selected by the nonpartisan U.S. Alliance for Election Excellence as a member of the Pathfinder Cohort in the Centers for Elections Excellence. 75 Election offices in the Pathfinder Cohort including 3 other California offices will focus on researching what it takes to achieve the standards for election excellence and chart pathways for the field. They'll help deepen our understanding of what resources are required to run excellent elections, how much excellent election administration costs, and how achieving excellence impacts voters. And they'll be first in line to pursue official recognition through the Alliance certification platform.

"Selection to the Pathfinder Cohort is a continuation of the work the Contra Costa elections team has done over the past 2 years as part of the inaugural cohort of centers. The first cohort drafted the voluntary, nonpartisan Values and Standards for Election Excellence. At a high level, the <u>values</u> lay out a shared vision for how local election offices across the country can aspire to excellence while the <u>standards</u> concretely define what excellent election administration looks like in practice.

"The Contra Costa County Elections Division is thrilled to continue our commitment to excellence through our selection as a Pathfinder!"

Board Briefs for June 2025

At its June 12^{th} meeting, the Board took the following action:



 Confirmed the Executive Committee approval of the design for card-sized handouts about the League for use at rallies and other events.

The Board also

- Heard plans by the Unite and Rise team for the June 14th Rally for Democracy at Broadway Plaza in Walnut Creek.
