St., Woodland, CA 95776. It will begin at 6:30 p.m.

LWV needs YOU to Advertise VOTE411.org!

When ballots go out in the mail beginning October 7, many people will start voting. During the whole month of October, it's crucial that you "get the word out" about VOTE411.org (the replacement for Voter's Edge)!

- When speaking with a friend, relative, neighbor or coworker, say:
 - "Are you sure you are registered to vote (at your current address)?
 If you didn't vote in the primary (or moved recently) it's a good idea to check."

To check one's voter registration in California, go to https://voterstatus.sos.ca.gov

o "Ballots come in the mail soon. Did you know that you can learn about candidates and measures on VOTE411.org just by entering your address? (then demonstrate on your phone)



- Follow LWVDV.org and Vote411 on Instagram (@lwvdiablovalley) and <u>Facebook</u>, and then share a post to your feed every few days until the election.
- Write your own post on your favorite social media platform(s): "I will be using Vote411.org to learn about candidates and ballot measures before I vote."
- When you access your ballot on VOTE411, and you see that a candidate
 has not posted information yet, you can immediately ask the candidate
 to please post.

Vote with the League!

The LWV does not endorse candidates or parties, but we do take stands on issues where we have educated ourselves and developed positions. Each election, the League of Women Voters of California analyzes all statewide ballot measures and makes recommendations for voters based on <u>our positions</u>. We call this <u>Vote with the League</u>!



Here are our voting recommendations from the League of Women Voters of California for the California statewide propositions on the 2024 ballot. *Click the links to see the description and analysis*.

YES on Prop 2 - School & Community College Facility Bonds

YES on Prop 3 - Freedom to Marry

YES on Prop 4 - Climate Protection Project Bonds

<u>YES on Prop 5</u> - Lower Voting Threshold On Local Housing & Infrastructure Bonds

YES on Prop 6 - End Slavery in California Act

YES on Prop 32- Raise Minimum Wage To \$18

NEUTRAL on Prop 33 - Expands Local Authority To Enact Rent Control On Residential Property

NO POSITION on Prop 34 - Restricts Spending By Health Care Providers Meeting Specified Criteria

NO on Prop 35 - **Permanent Funding for Medi-Cal Health Care Services**

NO on Prop 36 - Increase Penalties for Theft And Drug Trafficking

In addition, **LWVDV** is supporting Measure H on the Contra Costa ballot, to add a sales tax in Lafayette. <u>Background information and our message of</u> support is on our website.

¡Su Voto Importa!

The Contra Costa County Elections Office offered grants for non-partisan organizations this fall. **Our League applied for and received a \$2,500 grant** to develop, produce, and distribute two-sided 4x6 postcards in Spanish. With the help of Shawn Gilbert (who connected us with Doug Lezamata, President of the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce), Brooke Schwartz (who did all the graphic art work), Genoveva Calloway of LWV West Contra Costa County (who coordinated the Spanish verbiage and art work with Voto Latino), and Ana Pan (who helped the ad hoc committee with the verbiage and visuals), we were able to develop, produce, and distribute these postcards to Spanish-speaking voters.

In September, 1,000 cards were distributed at the Fiestas Patrias Parade in Richmond, the Latina Center, Familias Unidas, Downer Elementary School, a Raza History class, Monument Impact, Festival Latino in Concord, Los Medanos College, Support for Recovery, NAMI, Hope Solutions, and even a Hispanic grocery store. The reception to these postcards was very positive.

One side of the postcard focuses on registering to vote and why it is important; the other gives information on misinformation and offers websites to check whether information is credible. **Another 1,000 postcards have been printed** and will be distributed the week of September 30th.





We are now developing another postcard that will be distributed when ballots are mailed. One side will focus on voter resources for Spanish-speaking voters and the other will encourage them to vote because of issues that impact their families. We will also develop the postcards in English for social media use. The Elections Office has expressed interest in sharing them for social media use with the nine Bay Area elections offices. We also plan to share the postcard images with the LWVC so that other Leagues in the State can utilize them with their communities.


Healthcare: Looking at Nursing Homes

Board Briefs for September 2024

At its meeting on September 12, the Board took the following actions:



- Approved the Civil Discourse policy statement to be used at LWVDV events.
- Approved a donation to the NAACP education fund.
- Approved the revised Nonpartisan Policy for LWVDV.

The Board also

- Agreed that the Treasurer would purchase a CD with reserve funds, prior to the anticipated decrease in interest rates.
- Discussed ways to call attention to the Civil Discourse policy statement.
- Determined that the \$2,500 grant from the Elections Department would be used to print materials in Spanish to be distributed by LWVDV and through a partnership with Latino community groups.
- Heard that LWVC obtained funds to provide a Spanish version of the Pros and Cons flyer.
